Older branches are grey-brown and armed with stout spines; young branchlets are dark brown and densely leafy. Buds are broadly ovoid, about 5 by 4 mm, and covered in a dense, short woolly hair (tomentum). Leaves are narrow, shaped from oblanceolate to long-elliptic (broadest above the middle... *Atuna excelsa* subsp. *racemosa* grows up to 35 metres (110 ft) tall. The smooth bark is grey to black. The flowers are blue or white. The fruits are ellipsoid, roundish or pear-shaped and measure up to 7.5 cm (3 in) long. In the past, people pollarded trees for fodder to feed livestock or for wood. Fodder pollards produced "pollard hay" for livestock feed; they were pruned every two to six years so as to maximize the leafy material. Wood pollards were pruned every eight to fifteen years, which produced upright poles favored for fencing and boat construction. Supple young willow or hazel branches may be harvested as material for weaving baskets, fences, and garden constructions such as bowers. Nowadays, the practice is sometimes used for ornamental trees, such as crape myrtles in southern states of the US.

Pollarding The practice has been common in Europe since medieval times, and today is used in urban areas worldwide, primarily to maintain trees at a determined height. Pollarding is a pruning system involving the removal of the upper branches of a tree, which promotes the growth of a dense head of foliage and branches. century BCE. In ancient Rome, Propertius mentioned pollarding during the 1st century BCE. The practice has been common in Europe since medieval times, and today is used in urban areas worldwide, primarily to maintain trees at a determined height or to place new shoots out of the reach of grazing animals.

A key condition for this outcome is that there are sufficiently low transaction costs in the bargaining and exchange process. This 'theorem' is commonly attributed to Nobel Prize laureate Ronald Coase. The theorem states that if the provision of a good or service results in an externality and trade in that good or service is possible, then bargaining will lead to a Pareto efficient outcome regardless of the initial allocation of property. utility from their pear trees 03147e22f7

The symbol's popularity does not stem from any pre-existing association of the pear with a specific meaning, but rather from its graphic design. It is often mistakenly attributed to Honoré Daumier, though Charles Philipon claimed authorship, first using the image in November 1831 during a trial concerning press freedom. Although the government had recognized this freedom after the Trois Glorieuses, it was reluctant to uphold it. 03147e22f7
