The optimal temperature range for perishable food storage is 3 to 5 °C (37 to 41 °F). The low temperature reduces the reproduction rate of bacteria, so the refrigerator lowers the rate of spoilage

Absorption refrigerators are commonly used in recreational vehicles (RVs), campers, and caravans because the heat required to power them can be provided by either a propane fuel burner, a low-voltage DC electric heater (from a battery or vehicle electrical system) or a mains-powered electric heater.
