Fetal EEG the womb. To record the most accurate signals, scientists try to minimize the distance between the recording electrode and the neural activity that they want to detect. Given the difficulty of attaching electrodes to a fetus inside a uterus, doctors and scientists use a variety of techniques to record fetal brain activity. EEG captures the electrical activity in the vicinity of the recording electrodes. The majority of the neural electrical activity arises from the flow of current from the cell bodies of pyramidal neurons to their apical dendrites, which become depolarized by excitatory inputs from other neurons. Doctors and scientists use EEGs to detect and characterize brain activity, such as sleep states, potential seizures, or levels of a coma. Doctors can safely record EEG from the fetus without interference from the maternal heartbeat and uterine muscles by attaching suction-cup electrodes Fetal electroencephalography, also known as prenatal EEG includes any recording of electrical fluctuations arising from the brain of a fetus 25e88a8251

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Types of abortion restrictions in the United States Some state laws that impact the availability of abortions have been upheld by courts. Casey invalidated restrictions that create an undue burden on people seeking abortions. In 1973, the United States Supreme Court in Roe v. Wade recognized a constitutional right to obtain an abortion without excessive government restriction, and in 1992 the Court in Planned Parenthood v. Casey recognized a woman's right to decide whether to abort. In 2022, Roe and Casey were overturned by the Supreme Court in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, meaning that states may now regulate abortion in ways that were not previously permitted. Abortion in Hungary Under the current laws, abortions may be performed up to 12 weeks due to socioeconomic factors but may be extended up to 24 weeks in certain circumstances like risk to woman's life, health, rape or fetal impairment. Abortion in Georgia (U.S. state) Although this law was ruled unconstitutional by a Georgia superior court judge on September 30, 2024, it remains in effect while the state appeals the ruling. Georgia law HB481 does not specifically name D&C procedures as illegal, it generalizes to include procedures that stop the heartbeat of a fetus. Some medical professionals advise that a "true fetal heartbeat" cannot be detected until around 17 to 20 weeks of gestation when the chambers of the heart have become sufficiently developed. Zurawski v. State of Texas Amanda Zurawski, a Texas woman who was denied an abortion when she was 18 weeks pregnant because her fetus had a detectable heartbeat. On August 4, 2023, State District Court Judge Jessica Mangrum granted the plaintiffs a preliminary injunction; the state of Texas appealed this decision to the Texas Supreme Court later that same day. The Texas Supreme Court heard arguments in the case on November 28, 2023, and issued the decision on May 31, 2024. Since June 2022, SB 8 has been only one layer of a three-layer abortion ban in Texas. The U.S. Supreme Court's decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization overturned Roe v. Wade that month, which let Texas's separate "trigger law" — a near-total ban on abortion from fertilization, with only narrow medical exceptions — take effect about... 25e88a8251 In January 2023, the South Carolina Supreme Court had struck down a similar existing law as violating the state's privacy clause under Article 1, Section 10 of the South Carolina Constitution. Passed in 2021, that law had criminalized abortion once embryonic cardiac activity is detectable, which is around five or six weeks after the first day of the woman's last menstrual period. Causes may include pregnancy complications such as pre-eclampsia and birth complications, problems with the placenta or umbilical cord, birth defects, infections such as malaria and syphilis, and poor health in the mother. Risk factors include a mother's age over 35, smoking, drug use, use of assisted reproductive technology, and first pregnancy. Stillbirth may be suspected when no fetal movement is felt. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, No. 19-1392, 597 U.S. ____ (2022) ruling. In 2007, mandatory ultrasound requirements were passed by state legislators. Georgia has continually sought to legislate against abortion at a state level since 2011. The most recent example, 2019's HB 481, sought to make abortion illegal as soon as embryonic cardiac-cell activity can be detected; in most cases that is around the six-week mark of a pregnancy. An injunction was issued against this bill by a federal judge, who ruled that it contravened the Supreme Court's 1973 ruling. A poll conducted by the Pew Research Center in 2014 found that 49% of Georgians believed abortions should be illegal in all or most cases vs... 25e88a8251 In May 2021, Texas Governor Greg Abbott signed the Texas Heartbeat Act, also known as SB 8, into law. The law banned abortions after a fetal heartbeat could be detected, and allowed private citizens in Texas to sue anyone who helps someone obtain such an abortion. The law took effect in September of that year. After the Supreme Court of the United States overturned *Roe v. Wade* and *Planned Parenthood v. Casey* in its June 2022 decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, Texas' trigger law banning abortion went into effect on August 25, 2022. This law made performing an abortion a felony punishable by up to life in prison, with only narrow exceptions... 25e88a8251

Texas Heartbeat Act S. It was the first time a state had successfully imposed a six-week abortion ban since *Roe v. Wade*. The act lets members of the public sue anyone who performs or helps carry out an illegal abortion for a minimum of \$10,000 in statutory damages per abortion, plus court costs and attorneys' fees. The Texas Heartbeat Act, Senate Bill 8 (SB 8), is an act of the Texas Legislature that bans abortion after the detection of embryonic or fetal cardiac activity.
