Hepatic encephalopathy can occur in those with acute or chronic liver disease. Episodes can be triggered by alcoholism, infections, gastrointestinal bleeding, constipation, electrolyte problems, or certain medications. The underlying mechanism is believed to involve the buildup of ammonia in the blood, a substance that is normally removed by the liver. The diagnosis is typically based on symptoms after ruling out other potential causes. It may be supported by blood ammonia levels, an electroencephalogram, or computer tomography (CT scan) of the brain. 60b178f011

Macrogol In those with chronic constipation it works better than lactulose. Macrogol is used as a laxative to treat constipation in children and adults. data also support its use for the treatment of fecal impaction. It is usually followed by a number indicating the average molecular weight, indicating the length of the polymer of the specific molecule in use. A much larger dose of Macrogol is administered to clear the bowels, as preparation prior to a colonoscopy; the onset of the laxative effect is more rapid at this dosage, with onset of action typically occurring within an hour and lingering effects lasting for up to a few days. It is orally administered, with a resultant bowel movement typically occurring within a few days. Small amounts of Macrogol are also occasionally used similarly to baby laxative, as an excipient. Laxatives vary as to how they work and the side effects they may have.
