Experience Understood as a conscious event in the widest sense, experience involves a subject to which various items are presented. When understood in a more restricted sense, only sensory consciousness counts as experience. So an experienced hiker is someone who has actually lived through many hikes, not someone who merely read many books about hiking. In a slightly different sense, experience refers not to the conscious events themselves but to the practical knowledge and familiarity they produce. from the experience in the ordinary waking state. Examples of non-ordinary experiences are religious experiences, which are closely related to spiritual Experience refers to conscious events in general, more specifically to perceptions, or to the practical knowledge and familiarity that is produced by these processes. Hence, it is important that direct perceptual contact with the external world is the source of knowledge. In this sense, experience is usually identified with perception and contrasted with other types of conscious events, like thinking or imagining. This is associated both with recurrent. == Origins == The Association was founded in the US in 1981, in order to study and provide information on the phenomena of the near death experience (NDE). Today it has grown into an international organization, which includes a network of more than 50 local interest groups, and approximately 1,200 members worldwide. Local chapters, and support groups, are established in major U.S cities. IANDS also supports and assists near-death experiencers (NDErs) and people close to them. In one of its publications the organization has formulated its vision as one of building "global understanding of near-death and near-death-like experiences through research, education, and support". OBEs have been induced by traumatic brain injuries, sensory deprivation, near-death experiences, dissociative and psychedelic drugs, dehydration, sleep disorders, dreaming, and electrical stimulation of the brain, among other causes. It can also be deliberately induced by some. One in ten people have an OBE once, or more commonly, several times in their life. Psychologists and neuroscientists regard OBEs as dissociative experiences caused by different psychological and neurological factors. == History ==

Death anxiety to unveil the factors that might influence the amount of anxiety people experience in life. Death anxiety is distinct from necrophobia, which refers to an irrational or disproportionate fear of dead bodies or of anything associated with death. The sociological and psychological

Closer to the Light documents real-life accounts of near-death experiences in children. Morse had previously theorized that near-death experiences came from drugs administered during attempts to save someone's life. He conducted a study to determine which drugs caused such experiences but abandoned it after what he believes were credible reports of near death experiences. The results of the study were first published in 1986 in the American Journal of Disease in Children, with Closer to the Light documenting the study and other accounts of near death experiences in children in 1991.

Near-death studies Research on near-death experiences is mainly limited to the disciplines of medicine, psychology, and psychiatry. Since then the field has expanded, and now includes contributions from a wide range of researchers and commentators worldwide. The field was originally associated with a distinct group of North American researchers that followed up on the initial work of Raymond Moody, and who later established the International Association for Near-Death Studies (IANDS) and the Journal of Near-Death Studies.
