There are two types of NAS: prenatal and postnatal. Prenatal NAS is caused by discontinuation of drugs taken by the pregnant parent, while postnatal NAS is caused by discontinuation of drugs directly to the infant.

Major applications of drug testing include detection of the presence of performance enhancing steroids in sport, employers and parole/probation officers screening for drugs prohibited by law (such as cocaine, methamphetamine, and heroin) and police officers testing for the presence and concentration of alcohol (ethanol) in the blood commonly referred to as BAC (blood alcohol content). Those diagnosed with NAS may exhibit signs and symptoms that vary depending on the type of drugs used by the parent, how long the drugs were used, the amount of drug used that made it to the child, and symptoms associated with premature birth. Symptoms can appear as soon as 24 to 48 hours and as late as 5 to 10 days after birth. If the neonate (a newborn less than 4 weeks of age) is expected to have NAS, they may need to stay in the hospital to be monitored for a week. The company manufactured pain medicines such as hydromorphone, fentanyl, codeine, hydrocodone and oxycodone, also known by its brand name, OxyContin. Opioid epidemic in the United States The opioid epidemic unfolded in three waves. OxyContin, a controlled release formulation of oxycodone in 1996. However, drug users quickly learned how to simply crush the controlled release tablet There is an ongoing opioid epidemic (also known as the opioid crisis) in the United States, originating out of both medical prescriptions and illegal sources. The first wave of the epidemic in the United States began in the late 1990s, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), when opioids were increasingly prescribed for pain management, resulting in a rise in overall opioid use throughout subsequent years. It has been described by doctors and researchers as "one of the most devastating public health catastrophes of our time". The third wave, starting in 2013, was marked by a steep tenfold increase in the synthetic opioid-involved death rate as synthetic opioids flooded the US market. The second wave was from an expansion in the heroin market to supply already addicted people a8662a1f02

The term sedative describes drugs that serve to calm or relieve anxiety, whereas the term hypnotic describes drugs whose main purpose is to initiate, sustain, or lengthen sleep.
