Enterotoxigenic *Escherichia coli* The pathogenesis of EAEC involves the aggregation of and adherence of the bacteria to the intestinal mucosa, where they elaborate enterotoxins and cytotoxins that damage host cells and induce inflammation that results in diarrhea. Many studies reveal that EAEC are capable of surviving in the mucus layer. adherence pattern was reported in EAEC at a pH of 4. They may also cause urinary tract infections. EAEC are defined by their "stacked-brick" pattern of adhesion to the human laryngeal epithelial cell line HEp-2. == Characteristics == Clinical significance == Cysts of *Entamoeba* can survive for up to a month in soil or for up to 45 minutes under fingernails. Invasion of the intestinal lining may result in bloody diarrhea. If the parasite reaches the bloodstream it can spread through the body, most frequently ending up in the liver where it can cause amoebic liver abscesses. Liver abscesses can occur without previous diarrhea. Diagnosis is made by stool examination using microscopy, but it can be difficult to distinguish *E. histolytica* from other harmless *Entamoeba* species. An increased white blood cell count may be present in severe cases. The most accurate test is finding specific antibodies in the blood, though the antibody test may remain positive following...

This species polymerizes host cell actin. The *Strongyloides stercoralis* nematode can parasitize humans. The adult parasitic stage lives in tunnels in the mucosa of the small intestine. The genus *Strongyloides* contains 53 species, and *S. stercoralis* is the type species. *S. stercoralis* has been reported in other mammals, including cats and dogs. However, it seems that the species in dogs is typically not *S. stercoralis*, but the related species *S. canis*. Non-human primates are more commonly infected with *S. fuelleborni* and *S. cebus*, although *S. stercoralis* has been reported in captive primates. Other species of *Strongyloides* that are naturally parasitic in humans, but with restricted distributions, are *S. fuelleborni fuelleborni* in central Africa and *S. fuelleborni kellyi* in Papua New Guinea. Cancers on the right side of the large intestine (ascending colon and cecum) tend to be exophytic, that is, the tumor grows outwards from one location in the bowel wall. This very rarely causes obstruction of feces, and presents with symptoms such as anemia. Left-sided tumors tend to be circumferential, and can obstruct the bowel lumen, much like a napkin ring, and results in thinner caliber stools. *S. stercoralis* infection is associated with fecal contamination of soil or water. Hence, it is a very rare infection in developed... Human feces have similarities to the feces of other animals and varies significantly in appearance (i.e. size, color, texture), according to the state of the diet, digestive system, and general health. Normally, human feces are semisolid, with a mucus coating. Small pieces of harder, less moist feces can sometimes be seen impacted in the distal (final or lower) end. This is a normal occurrence when a prior bowel movement is incomplete, and feces are returned from the rectum to the large intestine, where water is further absorbed. Human feces together with human urine are collectively called human waste... Bacteria are responsible for more than half of cases, typically via foodborne illness and waterborne diseases. The bacteria enterotoxigenic *Escherichia coli* (ETEC) are typically the most common except in

Southeast Asia, where *Campylobacter* is more prominent. About 10 to 20 percent of cases are due to norovirus. Protozoa such as *Giardia* may cause longer-term disease.

Meconium Meconium, unlike later feces, is viscous and sticky like tar - its color usually being a very dark olive green and it is almost odorless. Meconium is normally retained in the infant's bowel until after birth Meconium is the earliest stool of a mammalian infant resulting from defecation. When diluted in amniotic fluid, it may appear in various shades of green, brown, or yellow. == Macroscopy == fa45d052a6 EAEC is now recognized as an emerging enteric pathogen. In particular, EAEC are reported as the second most common cause of traveler's diarrhea, second only to Enterotoxigenic E. coli, and a common cause of diarrhea amongst pediatric populations. It has also been associated with chronic infections in the latter, as well as in immunocompromised hosts, such as HIV-infected individuals. Awareness of EAEC was increased by a serious outbreak in Germany during 2011, causing over 5000 cases and at least 50 fatalities. Travelers' diarrhea TD is defined as the passage of unformed stool (one or more by some definitions, three or more by others) while traveling. torrents of watery diarrhea with flecks of mucus (described as "rice water" stools).
