4ebd50df10 There are two recognized forms of narcolepsy: type 1 and type 2. Narcolepsy type 1 features EDS with either cataplexy or cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) orexin levels of less than 110 pg/ml, but most cases present with both. Cataplexy appears as transient episodes of aberrant muscle tone (typically loss of muscle tone) triggered by strong emotion. In pediatric-onset narcolepsy, cataplexy can present with transient hyperkinetic features. Cataplexy may be mistaken for syncope, tics, or seizures. Narcolepsy type 2 (NT2) does not feature cataplexy, and CSF orexin levels are normal. Sleep-related hallucinations, both hypnagogic (going to sleep) and hypnopompic (on awakening), can be auditory, visual, or tactile and may occur independently of or in combination with an inability to move (sleep paralysis). 4ebd50df10 == Spear == 4ebd50df10

A subtype is known as King–Kopetzky syndrome or auditory disability with normal hearing (ADN),

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characterised by difficulty in hearing speech in the presence of background noise. This is essentially a failure or impairment of the cocktail party effect (selective hearing) found in most people. CT scanners use a rotating X-ray tube and a row of detectors placed in a gantry to measure X-ray attenuations by different tissues inside the body. The multiple X-ray measurements taken from different angles are then processed on a computer using tomographic reconstruction algorithms to produce tomographic (cross-sectional) images (virtual "slices") of a body. CT scans can be used in patients with metallic implants or pacemakers, for whom magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) is contraindicated.

Auditory processing disorder NeuroRehabilitation Auditory processing disorder (APD) is a neurodevelopmental disorder affecting the way the brain processes sounds. Pogoda TK, Goodrich GL (2010). It is thought that these difficulties arise from dysfunction in the central nervous system. Individuals with APD usually have normal structure and function of the ear, but cannot process the information they hear in the same way as others do, which leads to difficulties in recognizing and interpreting sounds, especially the sounds composing speech. It was first documented in the 19th century for its spiritual use, later isolated and synthesized for its psychoactive properties, briefly marketed in Europe as a stimulant, and ultimately controversially researched for its potential in treating addiction despite being classified as a controlled substance. Ibogaine can be semisynthetically produced from voacangine, with its total synthesis achieved in 1956 and its structure confirmed by X-ray crystallography in 1960. Originally thought to be a more general type of atypical parkinsonism, PSP has been linked to distinct clinical phenotypes including PSP-Richardson's syndrome (PSP-RS), which is the most common sub-type of the disease.
