Persistent fetal vasculature persistent hyperplastic primary vitreous (PHPV), is a rare congenital anomaly which occurs when blood vessels called the hyaloid vasculature, fail to regress

Vitreous chamber The vitreous chamber The vitreous chamber is the largest of the three chambers in the eye and is located behind the lens and in front of the optic nerve. The vitreous chamber is located in the posterior cavity of the eye. This chamber is occupied with a thick, clear gel-like substance called the vitreous humor

Each floater can be measured by its size, shape, consistency, refractive index, and motility. They are also called muscae volitantes (Latin for 'flying flies'), or mouches volantes (from the same phrase in French). The vitreous usually starts out transparent, but imperfections may gradually develop as one ages. The common type of floater, present in most people's eyes, is due to these degenerative changes of the vitreous. The perception of floaters, which may be annoying or problematic to some people, is known as myiodesopsia, or, less commonly, as myiodaeopsia, myodeopsia, or myodesopsia. It is not often treated, except in severe cases, where vitrectomy (surgery) and laser vitreolysis may be effective.

Macular hole break in the macula, located in the center of the eye's light-sensitive tissue called the retina. If the vitreous is firmly attached to the retina when ca625cda85

Hyaloid canal It is formed by an invagination of the hyaloid membrane, which encloses the vitreous body. (at the punctum caecum) to the lens. In the fetus, the hyaloid ca625cda85

Post-mortem chemistry The post-mortem. analyses of vitreous humor, cerebrospinal fluid, blood and urine is important in determining the cause of death or in elucidating forensic cases ca625cda85

They can become particularly noticeable when looking at a blank surface or an open monochromatic space, such as a blue sky. ca625cda85 Within the vertebrate eye, there are considered to be three chambers: anterior, posterior, and vitreous. The eye can also be classified as having two cavities: anterior and posterior. Both the anterior and posterior chambers are located within the anterior cavity, while the vitreous chamber is located in the posterior cavity. The best way to distinguish between the two cavities is to use the lens as a dividing point. The vitreous chamber is the largest of the three chambers and is located behind the lens and in front of the optic nerve. Recent research (2024) has demonstrated that the volume of the vitreous chamber varies significantly between individuals and is correlated with axial length and refractive status. Eyes with high axial myopia tend to have larger vitreous chamber volumes, whereas eyes with shorter axial length associated with hyperopia generally have smaller volumes... ca625cda85

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
