Swimfins, fins or flippers are fin-like Snorkeling (snorkelling in British and Commonwealth English) is the practice of swimming face-down in a body of water while breathing the ambient air through a shaped tube called a snorkel, usually with swimming goggles or a diving mask, and swimfins. The use of this equipment allows the snorkeler (British and Commonwealth English spelling: snorkeller) to observe the underwater environment for extended periods with relatively little effort, and to breathe while face-down at the surface. Seated entry requires sufficient upper-body strength to support the diver's weight on the arms while Scuba skills are skills required to dive safely using self-contained underwater breathing apparatus, known as a scuba set. Others are more advanced, although some diver certification and accreditation organizations may require these to endorse entry-

level competence. Instructors assess divers on these skills during basic and advanced training. Divers are expected to remain competent at their level of certification, either by practice or through refresher courses. Some certification organizations recommend refresher training if a diver has a lapse of more than six to twelve months without a dive. f557c1fe86

Swimming resistance. Swimming is a whole body exercise that requires endurance, skill and efficient techniques to maximize speed and minimize energy consumption. For example, they float to a greater or lesser extent, and move in a given direction by coordinating their forward thrusting actions, especially of their head and torso, with other actions such as stroking with their arms and kicking with their legs. Swimmers achieve locomotion by coordinating limb and body movements to achieve a level of buoyancy and hydrodynamic thrust that results in directional motion. Swimmers may opt to do some pre-swim exercises such as "arm

swings", in which they rotate their arms like a windmill, to help loosen their Swimming is the self-propulsion of a person through water, usually for recreation, sport, exercise, or survival f557c1fe86

Swimmers who are caught in a rip current and who do not understand what is happening, or who may not have the necessary water skills, may panic, or they may exhaust themselves by trying to swim directly against the flow of water. Because of these factors, rip currents are the leading cause of rescues by lifeguards at beaches.
