Recurrent brief depression (RBD) is defined as a mental disorder characterized by intermittent depressive episodes, not related to menstrual cycles in women, occurring between approximately 6–12 times per year. duration of the depressive episodes, such episodes are severe, and suicidal ideation and impaired function are rather common. These episodes should occur over the course of at least one year or more, fulfilling the diagnostic criteria for major depressive episodes (DSM-IV and ICD-10) except for duration in which RBD is less than 14 days (typically 5–7 days). RBD may be the only mental disorder present; however, RBD may also occur as part of a history of recurrent major depressive episodes or bipolar disorders. The majority of patients with RBD also report symptoms of anxiety and increased irritability. Hypersomnia is also rather frequent. RBD is also seen among some patients with personality disorders. Despite the short duration of the depressive episodes, such episodes are severe, and suicidal ideation and impaired function are rather common
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Most people who have suicidal thoughts do not go on to make suicide attempts, but suicidal thoughts are considered a risk factor. During 2008–09, an estimated 8.3

million adults aged 18 and over in the United States, or 3.7% of the adult U.S. population, reported having suicidal thoughts in the previous year, while an estimated 2.2 million reported having made suicide plans in the previous year. In 2019, 12 million U.S. adults seriously thought about suicide, 3.5 million planned a suicide attempt, 1.4 million attempted suicide, and more than 47,500 died by suicide. Additional risk factors include experiences of bullying, delayed diagnosis, and high intellectual ability. These risks are often under-recognized by clinicians and family members. the 5th edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM), and Gender incongruence of childhood is defined in the 11th edition of the International Classification of Diseases but considered a physical rather than psychiatric condition. The diagnoses replaced gender identity disorder in children, which had been present in the DSM since 1980 and ICD since 1990 but were considered stigmatizing towards transgender people. relationships. Homicidal ideation Homicidal ideation accounts for 2-5% of patient presentations to psychiatric facilities in the United States. 50-91% of people surveyed on university grounds in various places in the United States admit to having had a homicidal fantasy. Most people who have homicidal ideation do not commit homicide. There is a range of homicidal thoughts which spans from vague and fleeting to detailed and fully formulated plans without the act itself. who have homicidal ideation are at higher risk of other psychopathology than the normal population. ICD-11 classification of personality disorders This means that individuals are assessed along continuous trait dimensions, with personality disorders reflecting extreme or maladaptive variants of traits that are continuous with

normal personality functioning, and classified according to both severity of dysfunction and prominent trait domain specifiers. The ICD-11 classification of personality disorders, introduced in the 11th revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD-11), is an implementation of a dimensional model for classification of personality disorders. The ICD-11 classification of personality disorders differs substantially from the one in the previous edition, ICD-10; all distinct PDs have been merged into one: personality disorder, which can be coded as mild, moderate, severe, or severity unspecified

Effective suicide prevention efforts include limiting access to methods of suicide such as firearms, drugs, and poisons; treating mental disorders and substance abuse; careful media reporting about suicide; improving economic conditions; and psychotherapy, primarily dialectical behaviour therapy (DBT) and cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT). involve exact planning or intent. Risk factors for suicide include mental disorders, neurodevelopmental disorders, physical disorders, and substance abuse. Suicidology is the scientific study of suicide and self-destructive behavior. Some suicides are impulsive acts driven by stress (such as from financial or academic

difficulties), relationship problems (such as breakups or divorces), or harassment and bullying. Suicidality is defined as “the risk of suicide, usually indicated by suicidal ideation or intent, especially as evident Suicide is the act of intentionally causing one's own death. Although crisis hotlines, like 988 in North America and 13 11 14 in Australia, are common resources, their effectiveness has not been well studied. Those who have previously attempted suicide are at a higher risk for future attempts 9417777655

Homicidal ideation is not a disease itself, but may result from other illnesses such as delirium and psychosis. Psychosis, which accounts for 89% of admissions with homicidal ideation in one US study, includes substance-induced psychosis (e.g. amphetamine psychosis) and the psychoses related to schizophreniform disorder and schizophrenia. Delirium is often drug induced or secondary to general medical illness(es).
