For centuries, the phrase "man's best friend" has commonly been used to refer to... Major depressive disorder is heavily influenced by environmental and genetic factors. These factors include epigenetic modification of the genome which may result in a persistent change in gene expression without a change in the actual DNA sequence. Genetic and environmental factors can influence the genome throughout a life; however, an individual is most susceptible during childhood. Early life stresses that could lead to major depressive disorder include periodic maternal separation, child abuse, divorce, and loss. These factors can result in epigenetic marks that can alter gene expression and impact the development of key brain regions such as the hippocampus. Epigenetic factors, such as DNA methylation, could serve as potential predictors for the effectiveness of certain antidepressant treatments, as well as show associations with depression symptoms. The use of antidepressants can be also associated with changes in DNA methylation levels. Identifying gene with altered expression could result in new antidepressant treatments... Saliva testing is used to screen for or diagnose numerous conditions and disease states, including Cushing's disease, anovulation, HIV, cancer, parasites, hypogonadism, and allergies. Once they have formed, there is no clearly effective treatment, though various methods have been attempted and studied. Striae are caused by tearing of the dermis during periods of rapid growth of the body, such as during puberty or pregnancy, in which they usually form during the last trimester. Pregnancy-related striae are known as striae gravidarum. Striae may also be influenced by the hormonal changes associated with puberty, pregnancy, bodybuilding, or hormone replacement therapy. Usually on the belly, these striae also commonly occur on the breasts, thighs, hips, lower back, and buttocks. It is defined as blood glucose below 70 mg/dL (3.9 mmol/L). Hypoglycemia may result in headache, tiredness, clumsiness, trouble talking, confusion, fast heart rate, sweating, shakiness, nervousness, hunger, loss of consciousness, seizures, or death. Whipple's triad is used to properly identify hypoglycemic episodes. An embrace from a friend, relative, or even stranger can trigger the release of oxytocin, dopamine, and serotonin into the bloodstream.
