Education Formal education happens in a complex institutional framework, like public schools. The conflated definition of informal and non-formal learning explicates mechanisms Informal learning is characterized by a low degree of planning and organizing of the learning context, learning support, learning time, and learning objectives. It differs from formal learning, non-formal learning, and self-regulated learning, as it has no set objective in its learning outcomes, but an intent to act from the learner's standpoint (e.g., adult learning takes place informally and outside educational institutions)

The Global Gender Gap Report 2025 published by the World Economic Forum ranked India 131st out of 148 countries for overall gender parity, with comparatively low performance in the area of economic participation and opportunity.
