The exact cause of melasma is not fully understood, but it is believed to result from a combination of factors including ultraviolet (UV) radiation exposure, hormonal influences (such as pregnancy or the use of oral contraceptives and hormone replacement therapy), genetics, and skin irritation. Although melasma can affect anyone, it occurs more frequently in women, particularly those with darker skin types and those living in areas of intense sun exposure. It is considered a chronic and relapsing condition that may require ongoing management.

== Medical uses == Hydroquinone is produced industrially in two main ways. == Signs and symptoms == Ochronosis is most commonly associated with the rare metabolic disorder alkaptonuria, a genetic condition involving homogentisic acid oxidase deficiency. It may also occur as an acquired condition, known as *exogenous ochronosis*, resulting from prolonged topical application or systemic exposure to certain phenol derivatives, particularly hydroquinone.

Lentigo It is a harmless (benign) hyperplasia of melanocytes which is linear in its spread. "Evaluation of the efficacy of cysteamine 5% cream in the treatment of epidermal melasma: a randomized double-blind placebo-controlled trial" A lentigo (; plural lentigines,) is a small pigmented spot on the skin with a clearly defined edge, surrounded by normal-appearing skin. Because of this characteristic feature, the adjective lentiginous is used to describe other skin lesions that similarly proliferate linearly within the basal cell layer. This means the hyperplasia of melanocytes is restricted to the cell layer directly above the basement membrane of the epidermis where melanocytes normally reside.
