When the pupil takes on the shape of a tadpole, the condition is called tadpole pupil. Tadpole pupil, also known as episodic segmental iris mydriasis, is an ocular condition where the muscles of the iris begin to spasm, causing the elongation, or lengthening, of parts of the iris. These spasms can affect any segment, or portion, of the iris and involve the iris dilator muscle. Contractions of the iris dilator muscle, a smooth muscle of the eye running radially in the iris, can cause irregular distortion of the pupil, thus making the pupil look tadpole shaped and giving this condition its name. Episodic segmental iris mydriasis was first described and termed "tadpole pupil" in 1912 by HS Thompson. ee9d0f3447 Blepharospasm occurs in middle age and is more frequent among women than men. Blepharospasm These result in abnormal twitching or blinking, and in the extreme, sustained eyelid closure resulting in functional blindness. SPS occurs in about one in a million people and is most commonly found in middle-aged people. A small minority of patients have the paraneoplastic variety of the condition. Variants of the condition, such as stiff-limb syndrome, which primarily affects a specific limb, are often seen. ee9d0f3447 IESS is an epileptic encephalopathy, a childhood epilepsy syndrome arising during infancy. It can often arise as a complication of various other medical conditions. It is clinically defined by the occurrence of the characteristic epileptic spasms, episodes of clusters of tonic spasms of the axial and limb musculature. Such spasms are found in association with characteristic abnormal electroencephalogram pattern findings (hypsarrhythmia), and cognitive delay or deterioration. The peak age of onset is 4-6 months of age, with 90% of cases presenting during the first year of life. The spasms are usually resistant to conventional antiepileptics. They may persist beyond infancy, or, rarely, commence only later in childhood. Many individuals with the syndrome go on to develop other forms of epilepsy later in life (notably Lennox–Gastaut... ee9d0f3447

Stiff-person syndrome Spasms usually last for minutes Stiff-person syndrome (SPS), also known as stiff-man syndrome, is a rare neurological disorder of unclear cause characterized by progressive muscular rigidity and stiffness. Chronic pain, impaired mobility, and lumbar hyperlordosis are common symptoms. The stiffness primarily affects the truncal muscles and is characterised by spasms, resulting in postural deformities. These spasms primarily occur in the proximal limb and axial muscles. superimposed spasms and extreme sensitivity to touch and sound ee9d0f3447

Each spasm usually lasts for a few minutes. Other symptoms of tetanus may include fever, sweating, headache, trouble swallowing, high blood pressure, and a fast heart rate. In the most common type, the spasms begin in the jaw and then progress to the rest of the body. Spasms occur frequently for three to four weeks. Some spasms may be severe enough to fracture bones. Diagnostic criteria were proposed in the 1960s and refined two decades later. In the 1990s and 2000s, the role of antibodies in the condition became clearer. SPS patients generally have glutamic acid decarboxylase (GAD) antibodies, which seldom occur in the general population. In addition to blood tests for GAD, electromyography tests can help confirm the condition's presence. ee9d0f3447

Entropion In human cases, this condition is most common to people over 60 years of age. It is very uncomfortable, as the eyelashes continuously rub against the cornea causing irritation. Repeated cases of trachoma infection may cause scarring of the inner eyelid, which may cause entropion. Scarring (mechanical entropion) Spasm An eye infection called trachoma is still common in North Africa and South Asia Entropion is a medical condition in which the eyelid (usually the lower lid) folds inward. In epiblepharons, the eyelid margin itself is in the correct position, but the extra fold of skin causes the lashes to be misdirected. This is different from when an extra fold of skin on the lower eyelid causes lashes to turn in towards the eye (epiblepharon). The upper or lower eyelid can be involved, and one or both eyes may be affected. Entropion can also create secondary pain of the eye (leading to self trauma, scarring of the eyelid, or nerve damage). Entropion is usually caused by genetic factors. ligaments and muscles (senile entropion). When entropion occurs in both eyes, this is known as "bilateral entropion" ee9d0f3447

Blepharospasm is one form of a group of movement disorders called dystonia. It may be a primary or secondary disorder. The primary disorder is benign essential blepharospasm, in which term the qualifier essential indicates that the cause is unknown. Blepharospasm may occur as secondary to conditions including dry eyes and other specific ocular disease or conditions, Meige's syndrome and other forms of dystonia, and Parkinson's disease and other movement disorders. ee9d0f3447

A set of specialized hairs known as lashes grow from the upper and lower eyelid margins to further protect the eye from dust and debris. Moreover, the blink reflex protects the eye from foreign bodies. The condition should be distinguished from the more common, and milder, involuntary quivering of an eyelid, known as myokymia or fasciculation. ee9d0f3447 Health care professionals often recommend that all people should have periodic and thorough eye examinations as part of routine primary care, especially since many eye diseases are asymptomatic. Typically, a healthy individual who otherwise has no concerns with their eyes receives an eye exam once in their 20s and twice in their 30s. ee9d0f3447 The appearance of the human upper eyelid often varies between different populations. The prevalence of an epicanthic fold covering the inner corner of the eye account for the majority of East Asian and Southeast Asian populations, and is also found in varying degrees among other populations.
