The first commercial DHA self-tanner, Man-Tan, appeared in 1959, followed by Coppertone's "QT" (Quick Tan) in 1960; both produced an orange-toned result that gave early self-tanners a poor reputation. Sunless tanning Skin-applied products may be skin-reactive agents or temporary bronzers (colorants). Although some self-tanners contain sunscreen, its effect will not last long after application, and a fake tan itself will not protect the skin from UV exposure Sunless tanning refers to the effect of a suntan without exposure to the Sun. Sunless tanning involves the use of oral agents (carotenoids), or creams, lotions or sprays applied to the skin 307834ab23

Sunburn is an inflammatory response in the tissue triggered by the nucleic acid damage caused by UV radiation. Other symptoms include blistering, peeling skin, swelling, itching, and nausea. Special Sunburn is a form of radiation burn that affects living tissue, such as skin, that results from an overexposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation, usually from the Sun. radiation. Common symptoms in humans and other animals include red or reddish skin that is hot to the touch or painful, general fatigue, and mild dizziness. Prevention measures involve wearing protective clothing, sunscreen Windburn is a condition whereby a sunburn obtained in cool or cloudy conditions is incorrectly attributed to the effects of the wind rather than the sun, mostly in North America. a widely held misconception. The treatment of windburn is the same as for sunburn

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The fact that windburn was really misattributed sunburn, rather than a distinct condition, was shown as early as 1936 by English skin specialist Charles Howard White of Cambridge and American physicist William Henry Crew of New York University. Nonetheless, the accepted existence of windburn remains a widely held misconception.

Ultraviolet Wavelengths between 10 and 100 nanometers are called extreme ultraviolet and share some properties with soft X-rays. Ultraviolet radiation can aggravate Ultraviolet radiation (UV; sometimes called ultraviolet light) is electromagnetic radiation of wavelengths of 100–400 nanometers, shorter than that of visible light, but longer than X-

rays. UV radiation is present in sunlight and constitutes about 10% of the total electromagnetic radiation output from the Sun. sunscreen must be reapplied within 2 hours in order to prevent UV light from penetrating to sunscreen-infused live skin cells. Sun tanning Some people use chemical products that can produce a tanning effect without exposure to ultraviolet radiation, known as sunless tanning. People who deliberately tan their skin by exposure to the sun engage in a passive recreational activity of sun bathing.
