mono-culture crops with very little flora or fauna co-existence (van Elsen 2000). Modern organic farm practices such as the removal of pesticides and the inclusion of animal manure, crop rotation, and multi-cultural crops provide the chance for biodiversity to thrive.

Theory suggests that organic farming practices, which exclude the use of most synthetic pesticides and

fertilizers, may be beneficial for biodiversity. This is generally shown to be true for soils scaled to the area of cultivated land, where species abundance is, on average, 30% richer than that of conventional farms e83764cecd

Resource curse A 2022 study found that the resource curse is tied only The resource curse, also known as the paradox of plenty or the poverty paradox, is the hypothesis that countries with an abundance of natural resources (such as fossil fuels and certain minerals) have lower economic growth, lower rates of democracy, or poorer development outcomes than countries with fewer natural resources. As of at least 2023, there is no academic consensus on the effect of resource

abundance on economic development. Most experts believe the resource curse is not universal or inevitable but affects certain types of countries or regions under certain conditions. challenges the conventional academic wisdom on the relationship between oil and authoritarianism. There are many theories and much academic debate about the reasons for and exceptions to the adverse outcomes

In situations where differences are small – for example, the change of a few words in a large document or the change of a few records in a large table – delta encoding greatly reduces data redundancy.
