Sustainable forest management is another tool that is used in carbon farming. The overall goal of carbon farming is to create a net loss of carbon from the atmosphere. Increasing organic matter content in soils aids plant growth, improves soil water retention capacity and reduces fertilizer use. The technical term for this is carbon sequestration. The increase of biomass from roots and the soil's microbiome leads to an increase in the organic matter content of the soil. This is done by increasing the rate at which carbon is sequestered into soil and plant material. Carbon farming is one component of climate-smart agriculture. The increased ability to cultivate a larger... 64ace7142a The modern concept of vertical farming was proposed in 1999 by Dickson Despommier, professor of Public and Environmental Health at Columbia University. Despommier and his students came up with a design of a skyscraper farm that could feed 50,000 people. Although the design has not yet been built, it successfully popularized the idea of vertical farming. Current applications of vertical farming coupled with other state-of-the-art technologies, such as specialized LED lights, have resulted in over 10 times the crop yield as would be received through traditional farming methods. 64ace7142a

Organic farming Organic agriculture can be defined as "an integrated farming system that strives for sustainability, the enhancement of soil fertility and biological diversity while, with rare exceptions, prohibiting synthetic pesticides, antibiotics, synthetic fertilizers, genetically modified organisms, and growth hormones". In 2019, the global area dedicated to certified organic agriculture amounted to 70 million hectares (170 million acres), with more than half of this area being in Australia. Biological pest control methods, such as the fostering of insect predators, are also encouraged. However, by 2025 only 6 countries in the EU still farmed animals for fur, and three of these countries had issued a legal ban on the activity, effective within several years. Prior to their banning of fur-farming in 2025, Poland lead the European mink fur-farming industry. Only five countries in Europe still participate in the practice of fur farming, those being Finland, Denmark, Spain, Hungary and Greece. The United States is a major exporter of fur skins. Major export markets include China, Russia, Canada, and the EU.
