It occurs due to age-related changes in the lens (decreased elasticity and increased hardness) and ciliary muscle (decreased strength and ability to move the lens), causing the eye to focus light right behind rather than on the retina when looking at close objects. It is... e3e5019192 Each floater can be measured by its size, shape, consistency, refractive index, and motility. They are also called muscae volitantes (Latin for 'flying flies'), or mouches volantes (from the same phrase in French). The vitreous usually starts out transparent, but imperfections may gradually develop as one ages. The common type of floater, present in most people's eyes, is due to these degenerative changes of the

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vitreous. The perception of floaters, which may be annoying or problematic to some people, is known as myiodesopsia, or, less commonly, as myiodaeopsia, myodeopsia, or myodesopsia. It is not often treated, except in severe cases, where vitrectomy (surgery) and laser vitreolysis may be effective. e3e5019192

Naphazoline It is a sympathomimetic agent with marked alpha adrenergic activity that acts on alpha-receptors in the arterioles of the conjunctiva to produce constriction, resulting in decreased congestion. Temporary Naphazoline is a medicine used as a

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decongestant, and a vasoconstrictor added to eye drops to relieve red eye. decongestant. It has a rapid action in reducing swelling when applied to mucous membranes. Eye drops (brand names Clear Eyes, and Cleari) narrowing swollen blood vessels (ophthalmic arteries, and ophthalmic veins) to relieve red eye e3e5019192

Dry eye syndrome Symptoms Dry eye disease (DED), also known as keratoconjunctivitis sicca, is the condition of having dry eyes. Symptoms of dry eye include dryness in the eye, irritation, redness, discharge, blurred vision, and easily fatigued eyes. The term dry eye syndrome was formerly used, but is now avoided following advances that have established it as a distinct disease entity. distinct disease entity e3e5019192

Dry eye occurs either when the eye does not produce enough tears or when the tears evaporate too quickly. This can be caused by age, contact lens use, meibomian gland dysfunction, pregnancy, Sjögren's disease, vitamin A deficiency, omega-3 fatty acid deficiency, LASIK surgery, and certain medications such as antihistamines, some blood pressure medication, hormone replacement therapy, and antidepressants. Chronic

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conjunctivitis such as from tobacco smoke exposure or infection may also lead to the condition. Also, excessive pupil dilation may occur as an unwanted side effect. 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For most individuals, the normal range of intraocular pressure is between 10 mmHg and 21 mmHg. It is estimated that approximately 2-3% of people aged 52-89 years old have ocular hypertension of 25 mmHg and higher, and 3.5% of people 49 years and older have ocular hypertension of 21 mmHg and higher. e3e5019192 == Medical uses == e3e5019192 Primarily the treatment is for a condition called presbyopia. Laser Blended Vision can be achieved through laser eye surgery, usually performed as LASIK, although surface laser eye surgery PRK or LASEK can be used to produce the effect. Laser Blended Vision works by increasing the depth of field of each eye through subtle changes in the optics of the corneal spherical aberration. The increase in depth of field allows for the eyes to be corrected in such a way that the dominant eye is set for distance and intermediate vision while the non-dominant eye sees best in the intermediate to near range. == Pathophysiology == e3e5019192 One of the fluids inside the eye is called aqueous humor, and it contains 99% water and removes waste. Aqueous humor is transparent and thin, located in the anterior chamber, which is the area between the cornea and iris. Fluid should enter and exit the eye at appropriate rates to prevent fluid buildup, and when there is not appropriate fluid drainage, pressure builds up inside the eye. It was patented in 1934 and came into medical use in 1942. e3e5019192 Cataracts are most commonly due to aging but may also be caused by trauma to the eye, radiation exposure, conditions present from birth or complications from other conditions. Risk factors include diabetes, longstanding use of corticosteroid medication, obesity, other eye conditions, dietary deficiencies, smoking tobacco, prolonged exposure to sunlight and alcohol use. Cataract formation is primarily driven by oxidative stress and aging. Over time, the systems within the eye that keep the lens clear don't work as well, leading to the lens clouding. Diagnosis is typically made through an eye examination, including testing vision at various distances, slitlamp microscopy, and... e3e5019192 The cause of

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amblyopia can be any condition that interferes with focusing during early childhood. This can occur from poor alignment of the eyes (strabismic), an eye being irregularly shaped such that focusing is difficult, one eye being more nearsighted or farsighted than the other (refractive), or clouding of the lens of an eye (deprivational). After the underlying cause is addressed, vision is not restored right away, as the mechanism also involves the brain.

Possible clinical findings include:

'antiglaucomatous' eye drops, surgery, and/or laser eye surgery Ocular hypertension is the presence of elevated fluid pressure inside the eye (intraocular pressure), usually with no optic nerve damage or visual field loss. vision loss and damage to the eye from glaucoma

Elevated intraocular pressure is an important risk factor and symptom of glaucoma. Accordingly, most individuals with consistently elevated intraocular pressures of greater than 21mmHg, particularly if they have other risk factors, are treated in an effort to prevent vision loss from glaucoma. e3e5019192 Symptoms of dry eye include dryness in the eye, irritation, redness, discharge, blurred vision, and easily fatigued eyes.
