Hippocrates began Western society's development of medicine, through a delicate blending of the art of healing and scientific observations. Even though it is considered a singular corpus that represents Hippocratic medicine, they vary (sometimes significantly) in content, age, style, methods, and views practiced; therefore, authorship is largely unknown

The word "titration" descends from the French word *tiltre* (1543), meaning the proportion of gold or silver in coins or in works of gold or silver; i.e., a measure of fineness or purity. *Tiltre* became *titre*, which thus came to mean the "fineness of alloyed gold", and then the "concentration of a substance in a given sample". In 1828, the French chemist Joseph Louis Gay-Lussac first used *titre* as a verb (*titrer*), meaning "to determine the concentration of a substance in a given sample".

Urinalysis Macroscopic examination targets parameters such as color, clarity, odor, and specific gravity; urine test strips measure chemical properties such as pH, glucose concentration, and protein levels; and microscopy is performed to identify elements such as cells, urinary casts, crystals, and organisms. UV radiation is present in sunlight and constitutes about 10% of the total electromagnetic radiation output from the Sun. Ultraviolet radiation (UV; sometimes called ultraviolet light) is electromagnetic radiation of wavelengths of 100–400 nanometers, shorter than that of visible light, but longer than X-rays. Wavelengths between 10 and 100 nanometers are called extreme ultraviolet and share some properties with soft X-rays. A standard urine test strip may comprise up to 10 different chemical pads or reagents which react (change color) when immersed in, and then removed from, a urine sample. The test can often be read in as little as 60 to 120 seconds after dipping, although certain tests require longer. Routine testing of the urine with multiparameter strips is the first step in the diagnosis of a wide range of diseases. The analysis includes testing for the presence of proteins, glucose, ketones, haemoglobin, bilirubin, urobilinogen, acetone, nitrite and leucocytes as well as testing of pH and specific gravity or to test for infection by different pathogens. 3485a93ba7 Gout is due to persistently elevated levels of uric acid (urate) in the blood (hyperuricemia). This occurs from a combination of diet, other health problems, and genetic factors. At high levels, uric acid crystallizes and the crystals deposit in joints, tendons, and surrounding tissues, resulting in an attack of gout. Gout occurs more commonly in those who regularly drink beer or sugar-sweetened beverages, eat foods that are high in purines such as liver, shellfish, or anchovies, or are overweight. Diagnosis of gout may be confirmed by the

presence of crystals in the joint fluid or in a deposit outside the joint. Blood uric acid levels may be normal during an attack.

Horse colic Among domesticated horses, colic is the leading cause of premature death. What makes it tricky is that different causes can manifest with similar signs of distress in the animal. Colic surgery is usually an expensive procedure as it is major abdominal surgery, often with intensive aftercare. Clinical signs of colic generally require veterinary evaluation and treatment. especially in large quantities, can indicate ascites or uroperitoneum (urine in the abdomen). There are a variety of different causes of colic, some of which can prove fatal without surgical intervention. == Background == 3485a93ba7 To perform the test, blood is drawn into bottles containing a liquid formula that enhances microbial growth, called a culture medium. Usually, two containers are collected during one draw, one of which is designed for aerobic organisms that require oxygen, and one of which is for anaerobic organisms, that do not. These two containers are referred to as a set of blood cultures. Two sets of blood cultures are sometimes collected from two different blood draw sites. If an organism only appears in one of the two sets, it is more likely to represent contamination with skin flora than a true bloodstream infection. Titration The titrant reacts with a solution of analyte (which may also be termed the titrand) to determine the analyte's concentration. Excess glucose in urine may indicate diabetes in a patient. The volume of titrant that reacted with the analyte is termed the titration volume. A reagent, termed the titrant or titrator, is prepared as a standard solution of known concentration and

volume.
