The trip was arduous for the dogs and by the time the expedition arrived in Antarctica on 8 January 1912 only 28 of the dogs were still alive. These were split into two groups: nineteen stayed with Mawson at the expedition's main base and the remaining nine were sent with Frank Wild to the western base. All of the original dogs at the main base were dead by the end of 1912; accidents and illness had accounted for many of them and some were killed and eaten when food ran out on Mawson's main sledging journey. Dog communication Dogs may exchange information vocally, visually, or through smell. (muzzle/teeth). Visual communication includes mouth shape and head position, licking and sniffing, ear and tail positioning, eye contact, facial expression, and body posture. Crate training Confining a dog in a crate or cage restricts its movement and freedom, If crate training is not taken seriously, the dog may start soiling around the house. Most puppies can eventually tolerate crate training if it is introduced properly. Long-term or excessive crate confinement "may lead to emotional and behavioral deterioration over time. The initial stress from being confined can give way to "increased feelings of security, safety, and comfort" after repeated exposure to the crate. Crate advocates often claim that dogs are "den-dwelling" animals and that a crate can become a "den" substitute and a familiar and safe location for the pet.
