The kidney arises from the intermediate mesoderm and has three embryological forms: pronephros, mesonephros and metanephros. The pronephros and mesonephros are the primitive transient stages, while the metanephros is the final and functional stage that later forms the permanent kidneys. f014106e7d Symptoms of hydronephrosis differ among individuals depending on how quickly urine flow is blocked and whether the blockage is slowly or suddenly. Sudden obstruction in the outflow of urine may lead to severe flank pain, while an obstruction that forms slowly may cause little or no pain. Possible complications... f014106e7d

The diagnosis is usually made during antenatal and/or postnatal testing, when the ectopic kidney is found incidentally. Although most patients with renal ectopia are asymptomatic, some can develop symptoms due to complications such as kidney stones, urinary tract infections and hydronephrosis. f014106e7d

The metanephros is formed at around fifth to sixth week of gestation and is composed of the metanephric mesenchyme (the proper kidney) and the ureteric bud (collecting system and ureter). This metanephric unit then ascends from the pelvis into the retroperitoneal renal fossa while simultaneously rotating 90° so that the developing kidney is positioned vertically with... f014106e7d == Normal function and structure of the kidneys and the lungs == f014106e7d Most liver diseases cause only mild symptoms initially, but these diseases must be detected early. Hepatic (liver) involvement in some diseases can be of crucial importance. This testing is performed on a patient's blood sample. Some tests are associated with functionality (e.g., albumin), some with cellular

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integrity (e.g., transaminase), and some with conditions linked to the biliary tract (gamma-glutamyl transferase and alkaline phosphatase). Because some of these tests do not measure function, it is more accurate to call these liver chemistries or liver tests rather than liver function tests. f014106e7d

Nephrology Other experts advocate preserving the use of renal and nephro- including in "nephrology" and "renal replacement therapy". Some experts believe "renal" and "nephro-" should be replaced with "kidney" in scientific writings such as "kidney medicine" (instead of "nephrology") or "kidney replacement therapy". The word "renal" is an adjective meaning "relating to the kidneys", and its roots are French or late Latin. of the kidneys, specifically normal kidney function (renal physiology) and kidney disease (renal pathophysiology), the preservation of kidney health, Nephrology (from Ancient Greek νεφρός (nephros), meaning "kidney", and λόγος (logos), meaning "study") is a specialty for both adult internal medicine and pediatric medicine that concerns the study of the kidneys, specifically normal kidney function (renal physiology) and kidney disease (renal pathophysiology), the preservation of kidney health, and the treatment of kidney disease, from diet and medication to renal replacement therapy (dialysis and kidney transplantation) f014106e7d

It is typically due to a bacterial infection, most commonly Escherichia coli. Risk factors include sexual intercourse, prior urinary tract infections, diabetes, structural problems of the urinary tract, and spermicide use. The mechanism of infection is usually spread up the urinary tract. Less often infection occurs through the bloodstream. Diagnosis is typically based on symptoms and supported by urinalysis. Liver function tests The liver transaminases aspartate transaminase (AST or SGOT) and alanine transaminase (ALT or SGPT) are useful biomarkers of liver injury in a patient with some degree of intact liver function. Once present it is generally treated with antibiotics, such as ciprofloxacin or ceftriaxone. Those with severe disease may require treatment in hospital. In those with certain structural problems of the urinary tract or kidney stones, surgery may be required. f014106e7d Diseases of other bodily systems also have a direct effect on urogenital function. For instance, it has been shown that protein released by the kidneys in diabetes mellitus sensitizes the kidney to the damaging effects of hypertension. Diabetes also can have a direct effect on urination due to peripheral neuropathies, which occur in some individuals with poorly controlled diabetics. f014106e7d Autoantibodies called anti-glomerular basement membrane (anti-GBM antibodies), are the direct cause of anti-glomerular basement membrane (anti-GBM) disease. This is a rare autoimmune disorder that mainly impacts the kidneys, but may also affect the lungs. Instead of targeting external invaders such as pathogens or infections, these autoantibodies instead target the proteins in one's own basement membranes. Basement membranes are thin layers of proteins under the cells in the kidneys and lungs. When the membranes are attacked, they can be damaged.[1][2] f014106e7d

Hydronephrosis Hydronephrosis can affect one or both kidneys and can develop suddenly Hydronephrosis is a medical condition where the kidney becomes enlarged due to a complete or partial obstruction in the outflow of urine. This results in the dilation of

Kidney ischemia Several signs and symptoms include injury to the microvascular endothelium, apoptosis of kidney cells due to overstress in the endoplasmic reticulum, dysfunctions of the mitochondria, autophagy, inflammation of the kidneys, and maladaptive repair. Blood vessels shrink and undergo apoptosis which results in poor blood flow in the kidneys. More complications happen when failure of the kidney functions result in toxicity in various parts of the body which may cause septic shock, hypovolemia, and a need for surgery. What causes kidney ischemia is not entirely known, but several pathophysiology relating to this disease have been elucidated. which results in poor blood flow in the kidneys. Possible causes of kidney ischemia include the activation of IL-17C and hypoxia due to surgery or transplant.
