The term lean refers to the tendency for users to have difficulty standing up straight and walking while under the influence of the drug. "Purple drank" references the mixture's typically purple hue, as the cough syrups employed are often purple in color, and the African-American Vernacular English term "drank" for an alcoholic beverage. Side effects of phenibut can include sedation, sleepiness, nausea, irritability, agitation, dizziness, euphoria, and sometimes headache, among others. Overdose of phenibut can produce marked central nervous system depression including unconsciousness. The medication is structurally related to the neurotransmitter γ -aminobutyric acid (GABA), and hence is a GABA analogue. Phenibut is thought to act as a GABAB receptor agonist, similarly to baclofen and γ -hydroxybutyrate (GHB). However, at low concentrations, phenibut mildly increases the concentration of dopamine in the brain, providing stimulatory effects in addition to the anxiolysis. As is typical of opioids, common side effects include constipation, itchiness, and nausea. Serious side effects may include hallucinations, seizures, increased risk of serotonin syndrome, decreased alertness, and drug addiction. A change in dosage may be recommended in those with kidney or liver problems. It is not recommended in those who are at risk of suicide or in those who are pregnant. While not recommended in women who are breastfeeding, those who take a single dose should not generally have to stop breastfeeding. Tramadol is converted in the liver to O-desmethyiltramadol (desmetramadol), an opioid with a stronger affinity for the μ -opioid receptor. It was patented in 1947 and came into medical use in 1953. It was first launched in the United States by the McNeil Corporation under the brand name Clistin. Carbinoxamine is available in various countries around the world by itself, combined with decongestants such as pseudoephedrine, and also with other ingredients including paracetamol, aspirin, and codeine. Phenibut was developed in the Soviet Union and was introduced for medical use in the 1960s. Today, it is marketed for medical use in Russia, Ukraine, Belarus, Kazakhstan, and Latvia. The medication is not approved for clinical use in the United States and most of Europe... It is found in the seeds, fruits... Progesterone is well tolerated and often produces few or no side effects. However, a number of side effects are possible, for instance mood changes. The medication is a naturally occurring progestogen and hence is an agonist of the progesterone receptor (PR), the biological target of progestogens like endogenous progesterone. When exceeding approved dosages, dextromethorphan acts as a dissociative hallucinogen. It has multiple mechanisms of action, including actions as a nonselective serotonin–norepinephrine reuptake inhibitor and a sigma-1 receptor agonist. Dextromethorphan and its major metabolite dextrorphan also block the NMDA receptor at high doses, producing effects similar to those of other dissociative anesthetics such as ketamine, nitrous oxide, and phencyclidine. eb33c613a3

It is in the morphinan class of medications with dissociative and stimulant properties (at lower doses). Lean (drug) The beverage originated in Houston as early as the 1960s and is popular in hip hop culture, especially within the Southern United States. Dextropropoxyphene is sometimes combined with paracetamol (acetaminophen). Trade names include Darvocet-N, Di-Gesic, and Darvon with APAP (for dextropropoxyphene and paracetamol). The British approved name (i.e. the generic name of the active ingredient) of the paracetamol/dextropropoxyphene preparation is co-proxamol (sold under a variety of brand names); however, it has been withdrawn since 2007, and is no longer available to new patients, with exceptions. Carbinoxamine In June 2006 the FDA announced that Carbinoxamine is an antihistamine and anticholinergic agent. Carbinoxamine is a histamine antagonist, specifically an H1-antagonist. It is used for hay fever, vasomotor rhinitis, mild urticaria, angioedema, dermatographism and allergic conjunctivitis. The maleic acid salt of the levorotatory isomer is sold as the prescription drug rotoxamine. with decongestants such as pseudoephedrine, and also with other ingredients including paracetamol, aspirin, and codeine eb33c613a3

In June 2006 the FDA announced that more than 120 branded pharmacy products containing carbinoxamine were being illegally marketed and demanded they be removed from the marketplace. Caffeine Caffeine acts by blocking the binding of adenosine at a number of adenosine receptor types, inhibiting the centrally depressant effects of adenosine and enhancing the release of acetylcholine. Caffeine has a three-dimensional structure similar to that of adenosine, which allows it to bind and block its receptors. Caffeine also increases cyclic AMP levels through nonselective inhibition of phosphodiesterase, increases calcium release from intracellular stores, and antagonizes GABA receptors, although these mechanisms typically occur at concentrations beyond usual human consumption. caffeine (100–130 mg) to commonly prescribed pain relievers such as paracetamol or ibuprofen modestly improves the proportion of people who achieve pain Caffeine is a central nervous system (CNS) stimulant of the methylxanthine class and is the most commonly consumed psychoactive drug globally. It is mainly used for its eugeroic (wakefulness promoting), ergogenic (physical performance-enhancing), or nootropic (cognitive-enhancing) properties (particularly in workplace settings); it is also used recreationally, often in social settings eb33c613a3

Codeine Tablets of codeine in combination with aspirin or acetaminophen (paracetamol) and intended for pain relief are listed Codeine is an opiate and prodrug of morphine mainly used to treat pain, coughing, and diarrhea. Its effects last for about four to six hours. Evidence does not support its use for acute cough suppression in children. In Europe, it is not recommended as a cough medicine for those under 12 years of age. It is generally taken orally. It is commonly used as a recreational drug. or prescribed to discourage abuse. It is typically used to treat mild to moderate degrees of pain. It is found naturally in the sap of the opium poppy, Papaver somniferum. Codeine exhibits abuse potential similar to other opioid medications, including a risk of addiction and overdose. Greater benefit may occur when combined with paracetamol (acetaminophen) as codeine/paracetamol or a nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) such as aspirin or ibuprofen.
