These symptoms typically start in minutes to hours and then increase very rapidly to life-threatening levels. Pegvaliase It is a phenylalanine (Phe)-metabolizing enzyme. The safety and efficacy of pegvaliase were studied in two clinical trials

in adult participants with Pegvaliase, sold under the brand name Palynziq, is a medication used for the treatment of the genetic disease phenylketonuria (PKU). Bupivacaine It typically begins working within 15 minutes and lasts for 2 to 8 hours. In nerve blocks, it is injected around a nerve that supplies the area, or into the spinal canal's epidural space. or

It is available mixed with a small amount of epinephrine to increase the duration of its action
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Possible side effects include sleepiness, muscle twitching, ringing in the ears, changes in vision, low blood pressure, and an irregular heart rate. Concerns exist that injecting it into a joint can cause problems with the cartilage. Concentrated bupivacaine is not recommended for epidural freezing. Epidural freezing may also increase the length of labor. Dopamine (medication) In children epinephrine or norepinephrine is generally preferred while in adults norepinephrine is generally preferred for very low blood pressure. It is given intravenously or intraosseously as a continuous infusion. In newborn babies it continues to be the preferred treatment for very low blood pressure. Croup can be caused by a number of viruses including parainfluenza and influenza virus. Rarely is it due to a bacterial infection. Croup is typically diagnosed based on signs and symptoms after potentially more severe causes, such as epiglottitis or an airway foreign body, have been ruled out. Further investigations, such as blood tests, X-rays and cultures, are usually not needed.

Bupivacaine was discovered in 1957. It is on the World Health Organization's List of Essential Medicines. Bupivacaine is available as a generic medication. An implantable formulation of bupivacaine (Xaracoll) was approved for medical use in the United States in August 2020. It was approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for use in the United States in 2018. The FDA considers it to be a first-in-class medication. Common causes include allergies to insect bites and stings, allergies to foods—including nuts, peanuts, milk, fish, eggs; allergies to medications – including some antibiotics and non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs); or allergies to anaesthetics or latex. Other causes can include physical exercise, and cases may also occur in some people due to escalating reactions to simple throat irritation or may also occur without an

Anaphylaxis Other measures, such as antihistamines and steroids, are complementary. Additional doses of epinephrine may be required. It typically causes more than one of the following: an itchy rash, throat closing due to swelling that can obstruct or stop breathing; severe tongue swelling that can also interfere with or stop breathing; shortness of breath, vomiting, lightheadedness, loss of consciousness, low blood pressure, and medical shock. Carrying an epinephrine autoinjector Anaphylaxis is a serious and potentially fatal allergic reaction that can progress rapidly
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Croup Hospitalization is required Croup (KROOP; from southeastern Scots, prob. echoic), also known as croupy cough, is a type of respiratory infection that is usually caused by a virus. These symptoms may be mild, moderate, or severe. Croup is usually treated with a single dose of steroids by mouth. Fever and runny nose may also be present. The infection leads to swelling inside the trachea, which interferes with normal breathing and produces the classic symptoms of "barking/brassy" cough, inspiratory stridor, and a hoarse voice. In more severe cases inhaled epinephrine may also be used. It often starts or is worse at night and normally lasts one to two days be985cfc2c

Common side effects include shakiness, anxiety, and sweating. A fast heart rate and high blood pressure may occur. Occasionally, it may result in an abnormal heart rhythm. While the safety of its use during pregnancy and breastfeeding is unclear, the benefits to the mother must be taken into account. be985cfc2c

Epinephrine (medication) It may also be used for asthma when other treatments are not effective. Epinephrine, also known as adrenaline, is a medication and hormone. Inhaled epinephrine may be used to improve the symptoms of croup. As a medication, it is used to treat several conditions, including anaphylaxis, cardiac arrest, asthma, and superficial bleeding. It is given intravenously, by injection into a muscle, by inhalation, or by injection just under the skin. Inhaled epinephrine may be used to improve the symptoms of croup. It may also be used for asthma when other treatments are not effective.

Common side effects include worsening kidney function, an irregular heartbeat, chest pain, vomiting, headache, or anxiety. If it enters into the soft tissue around the vein local tissue death may occur. The medication phentolamine can be given to try to decrease this risk. It is unclear if dopamine is safe to use during pregnancy or breastfeeding. At low doses dopamine mainly triggers dopamine receptors and β_1 -adrenergic receptors while at

high doses it works via α -adrenergic receptors. be985cfc2c

Metered-dose inhaler The medication in a metered dose inhaler is most commonly a bronchodilator, corticosteroid or a combination of both for treating asthma and COPD. Other medications less commonly used but also administered by MDI are mast cell stabilizers, such as cromoglicate or nedocromil. It is the most commonly used delivery system for treating asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and other respiratory diseases.
