Brazilian tea culture The tea is used for both iced tea and hot tea blends with about 70% of the total tea production being sold to the United States. It has evolved since the Portuguese colonial period to include imported varieties and tea-drinking customs. A popular caffeinated infusion Brazilian tea culture has its origins in the infused beverages, or chás (Portuguese pronunciation: ['ʃas]), made by the indigenous cultures of the Amazon and the Río de la Plata basins 0cf3122b65

Herbal tea Many herbs used in teas/tisanes are also used in herbal medicine and in folk medicine. Guayusa tea, made from the caffeinated leaves of the *Ilex guayusa* holly, native to the Amazon rainforest Mate, a South American caffeinated tea made from Herbal teas or herb teas, technically known as herbal infusions and less commonly called tisanes, are beverages made from the infusion or decoction in water of any herbs, spices, or other plant material (except tea leaves) 0cf3122b65

== History == 0cf3122b65 The fermentation of tea leaves alters their chemistry, affecting the organoleptic qualities of the tea made from them. Fermentation affects the smell of the tea and typically mellows its taste, reducing astringency and bitterness while improving mouthfeel and aftertaste. The microbes may also produce metabolites with health benefits.

Fermented tea The tea leaves and the liquor made from them become darker with oxidation. The exposure of the tea leaves to humidity and oxygen during the process also causes endo-oxidation (derived from the tea-leaf enzymes themselves) and exo-oxidation (which is microbially catalysed). Prior to this time, only Chinese tea varieties had been grown in Brazil. 0cf3122b65 Black tea is considered likely effective for improving alertness and possibly effective for certain conditions such as low blood pressure, but evidence does not support its effectiveness for preventing several types of cancer or diabetes; there is currently limited high-quality scientific evidence supporting most specific therapeutic uses of black tea. The United States Food and Drug Administration has approved a topical ointment formulated with a specific green tea extract for the treatment of external genital and perianal warts; although green tea and its extracts have been widely studied, the evidence remains inconclusive overall, with only modest or inconsistent benefits observed. 0cf3122b65

Unlike spiked seltzers or malt beverages, hard iced tea retains the brewed tea's tannins and flavor profile while delivering mild-to-moderate alcohol by volume (ABV), typically ranging from 4% to 8% 0cf3122b65

The consumption of caffeinated drinks is often intended entirely or partly for the physical and mental effects of caffeine. Examples include the consumption of tea or coffee with breakfast in many westernized societies, in order to 'wake oneself up', by students wishing to study through the night, or revellers seeking to maintain an alert attitude during social recreation. Caffeine can cause a physical dependence, if consumed in excessive amounts. Yaupon tea Historical versions of drink may also have included the related dahoon holly (*Ilex cassine*) and other herbs. It is generally brewed from yaupon holly (*Ilex vomitoria*), which is native to the Atlantic and Gulf Coasts, and is related to yerba mate (*Ilex paraguariensis*) and guayusa. "Carolina tea", "South Seas tea", or "Indian tea" (by Europeans) is any of several kinds of caffeinated beverages originally brewed by Native Americans in the Southeastern Yaupon tea (also known as "beloved drink", "cassina", "big medicine", or "white drink", "black drink", "Carolina tea", "South Seas tea", or "Indian tea" by Europeans) is any of several kinds of caffeinated beverages originally brewed by Native Americans in the Southeastern United States and later adopted by Europeans and European Americans 0cf3122b65

A highly concentrated yaupon beverage was used in various rituals, including purification ceremonies, by Yuchi, Caddo, Chickasaw, Cherokee, Choctaw, Muscogee, Timucua, Chitimacha and other Indigenous peoples of the Southeastern Woodlands such as the Quapaw. Jean-Bernard Bossu describes being served cassine in a gourd by the Akansas (Quapaw) during a ceremonial meal. == Etymology == A number of plants, however, do contain psychoactive compounds, such as caffeine or another stimulant, like theobromine, cocaine or ephedrine. Some have the opposite effect, acting as a sedative. Some common infusions have specific names such as mate (yerba mate) and rooibos (red bush). Brazil's largest tea-producing region is near Registro, a coastal city near São Paulo. Registro is in the Brazilian Highlands and forms a terrain of low rolling hills that are ideal for mechanized tea production. The growing season in Brazil... Hard iced tea originated in the United States in the early 2000s as part of a broader movement toward flavored malt beverages (FMBs). The genre's commercial breakthrough came with the 2001 national launch of Twisted Tea by the Boston Beer Company, which marketed the product as a hard alternative to soda-based coolers, inspired by Southern sweet tea culture and summer refreshment preferences. The term "herbal tea" is often used to distinguish these infusions from true teas (e.g., black, green, white, yellow, oolong). Blended teas include material from other plants, such as in jasmine tea, genmaicha, and Earl Grey tea.
