Early on, symptoms may not be noticed. Over time, the thyroid may enlarge, forming a painless goiter. Most people eventually develop hypothyroidism with accompanying weight gain, fatigue, constipation, hair loss, and general pain. After many years, the thyroid typically shrinks in size. Potential complications include thyroid lymphoma. Further complications of hypothyroidism can include high cholesterol, heart disease, heart failure, high blood pressure, myxedema, and potential problems in pregnancy. 5a313db6b1 Propylthiouracil is generally well tolerated, with side effects occurring in one of every 100 patients. The most common side effects are related to the skin and include rash, itching, hives, abnormal hair loss, and skin pigmentation. Other common side effects... 5a313db6b1 Thyroid hormones are one of the factors responsible for the modulation... 5a313db6b1 Causes of congenital hypothyroidism include iodine deficiency, developmental defect in the thyroid gland or the hypothalamus/pituitary either due to a genetic defect or an unknown cause, or dysfunction of the thyroid gland or the thyroid hormone. The source of the CH can occur at the level of the hypothalamus/pituitary gland (central CH) or the thyroid gland (primary CH). In both cases, the initial newborn screening will reflect low free thyroid hormone (fT4) levels, with elevated thyroid stimulating hormone (TSH) in primary CH and low/normal TSH in central CH. 5a313db6b1 The major form of thyroid hormone in the blood is thyroxine (T4), whose half-life of around one week is longer than that of T3. In humans, the ratio of T4 to T3 released into the blood is approximately 14:1. T4 is converted to the active T3 (three to four times more potent than T4) within cells by deiodinases (5'-deiodinase). These are further processed by decarboxylation and deiodination to produce iodothyronamine (T1a) and thyronamine (T0a). All three isoforms of the deiodinases are selenium-containing enzymes, thus dietary selenium is essential for T3 production. Calcitonin, a peptide hormone produced and secreted by the thyroid, is usually not included in the meaning of "thyroid hormone". 5a313db6b1 Hashimoto's thyroiditis is thought to develop due to a combination of genetic and environmental factors. Risk factors include a family history of the condition and having another autoimmune disease. Diagnosis is confirmed with blood tests for TSH, thyroxine (T4), antithyroid autoantibodies, and ultrasound. Other conditions that can produce similar symptoms include Graves' disease and nontoxic nodular goiter. 5a313db6b1

Use during pregnancy may harm the baby. Propylthiouracil is in the antithyroid family of medications. If untreated soon after birth, severe congenital hypothyroidism can lead to growth failure and permanent intellectual disability. Significant deficiency may cause excessive sleeping, reduced interest in nursing, poor muscle tone, low or hoarse cry, infrequent bowel movements, significant jaundice, and low body temperature. The initial phase of hyperthyroid symptoms occurs transiently about two to six months postpartum. Typical symptoms include irritability, nervousness, palpitations, and heat intolerance. Hormonal disturbances during this phase tend to occur with lower intensity compared with the hypothyroid phase. As a result, the hyperthyroid phase may pass undetected. Levothyroxine Levothyroxine is taken orally (by mouth) or given by intravenous injection. Levothyroxine is safe and effective for children with hypothyroidism; the goal of treatment for children with hypothyroidism is to reach and preserve normal Levothyroxine, also known as L-thyroxine, is a synthetic form of the thyroid hormone thyroxine (T4). Levothyroxine has a half-life of 7. 5 days when taken daily, so about six weeks is required for it to reach a steady level in the blood. It is used to treat thyroid hormone deficiency (hypothyroidism), including a severe form known as myxedema coma. It may also be used to treat and prevent certain types of thyroid tumors. It is not indicated for weight loss 5a313db6b1

Although the majority of patients experience significant improvement and remission after proper medical care, health care providers should be aware of variability in individual response to hyperthyroidism and individual sensitivity to thyroid hormone fluctuations. Patients with Graves' disease can also undergo periods of hypothyroidism (inadequate production of thyroid hormone; see symptoms of hypothyroidism), due to the challenges of finding the right dosage of thyroid hormone suppression and/or supplementation. The body's need for thyroid hormone can also change over time, such as in the first months after radioactive iodine treatment... 5a313db6b1
