== History == f956c596bc In 2016, there were 88,665 elementary schools (66,758 public and 21,907 private) in the United States. f956c596bc Previous Elementary Education Acts had not required (and allowed potential difficulties in) the drawing up of bye-laws on school attendance by local school boards; the 1880 Act removed those difficulties, made the drawing up of such bye-laws mandatory, and allowed central government to impose such bye-laws where local boards had not done so. If the

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bye-laws specified minimum requirements (age and/or educational standard reached) to be attained before a child could leave school, it was illegal to employ a child under thirteen who did not satisfy one or the other requirement. The act therefore removed uncertainty on whether children being educated 'half-time' under the educational provisions of the Factory Acts were thereby excluded from the scope of the Elementary Education Acts (they were not). f956c596bc == Definition == f956c596bc As an intervention programme, it started in 2002 and SSA has been operational since 2000–2001. However, its roots go back to 1993–1994, when the District Primary Education Programme (DPEP) was launched, with an aim of achieving the objective of universal primary education. DPEP, over several phases, covered 272 districts in 18 states of the country. The expenditure on the programme was shared by the Central Government (85%) and the State Governments (15%). The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948) declared that elementary and fundamental Secondary education or post-primary education covers two phases on the International Standard Classification of Education scale: Level 2 (lower secondary education, less commonly junior secondary education) is the second and final phase of basic education, and Level 3 (upper secondary education or senior secondary education) is the phase immediately preceding tertiary education. committed to education for all but the definition was difficult to formulate. Compulsory education sometimes extends to age 20 and further. Children typically enter the lower secondary phase around age 12. Primary education in the United States Elementary schools normally continue through sixth grade, which the students normally complete when they are age 11 or 12. Subsequent years are usually numbered being referred to as first grade, second grade, and so forth. Some elementary schools graduate after the 4th or 5th grade and transition students into a middle school. The first year of primary education is commonly referred to as kindergarten and begins at or around age 5 or 6. Preschool programs, which are less formal and usually not mandated by law, are generally not considered part of primary education. At the start of the 19th century, the only schooling available to these young people was run by private concerns or by charities, and was often of a very poor standard. The problem of how the education of. In an effort to expand this "voluntary" system, the government made grants available to these societies, initially for new school buildings but later towards their running costs. It became apparent that although this system worked reasonably well in rural communities, it was far less successful in the rapidly expanding industrial cities, and that Britain was falling behind the rest of the developed world. Elementary schools were the first schools in England and Wales intended to give a basic education to the children of working class families. Further legislation made school attendance compulsory, and eventually free of charge. In 1870, an act of parliament established elected school boards throughout England and Wales, which were empowered to create secular "board schools" funded by local taxation where there was no provision by the church societies. In the first decades of that century, a network of elementary schools was established by societies backed by the Christian churches f956c596bc

The International Standard Classification of Education considers primary education as a single phase where programs are typically designed to provide fundamental reading, writing, and mathematics skills and establish a solid foundation for learning.
