EFA is a technique within factor analysis whose overarching goal is to identify the underlying relationships between measured variables. Examples of measured variables could be the physical height, weight, and pulse rate of a human being. Researchers must carefully consider the number of measured variables to include in the analysis. Usually, researchers would have a large number of measured variables, which are assumed to be related to a smaller number of "unobserved" factors. Impact factors began to be calculated yearly starting from 1975 for journals listed in the Journal Citation Reports (JCR). ISI was acquired by Thomson Scientific & Healthcare in 1992, and became known as Thomson ISI. In 2018, Thomson-Reuters spun off and sold ISI to Onex Corporation and Baring Private Equity Asia. Factor analysis For example, it is possible that variations in six observed variables mainly reflect the variations in two unobserved (underlying) variables. Factor analysis searches for such joint variations in response to unobserved latent variables. The observed variables are modelled as linear combinations of the potential factors plus "error" terms, hence factor analysis can be thought of as a special case of errors-in-variables models.
