Intravenous amoxicillin-clavulanate Melioidosis is an infectious disease caused by a gram-negative bacterium called Burkholderia pseudomallei. pseudomallei experience no symptoms, but complications can range from fever and skin changes to pneumonia, abscesses, and septic shock, which can be fatal. Approximately 10% of people with melioidosis develop symptoms that last longer than two months, termed "chronic melioidosis"

Gingivitis The most common form of gingivitis, and the most common form of periodontal disease, is in response to bacterial biofilms (also called plaque) that are attached to tooth surfaces, termed plaque-induced gingivitis. Either amoxicillin, cephalexin, or minocycline in 500 grams of a non-alcoholic fluoride Gingivitis, also known as ulitis, is a non-destructive disease that causes inflammation of the gums. oral irrigator daily with a mouthwash containing an antibiotic. The p-i concept links pharmacology with immunology: It implies that drugs bind directly, as an off-target activity to immune receptors which results in various forms of T cell stimulations. P-i thus starts with an off-target pharmacological activity of the drug followed by a cascade

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of immunological events which always starts with T cell activation, even if the drug did not bind to the T cell itself but to an antigen presenting cell (APC). 34ba0539c2

The medical standard for active TB is a short course treatment involving a combination of isoniazid, rifampicin (also known as Rifampin), pyrazinamide, and ethambutol for the first two months. During this initial period, Isoniazid is taken alongside pyridoxal phosphate to obviate peripheral neuropathy. Isoniazid is then taken concurrently with rifampicin for the remaining four months of treatment (6-8 months for miliary tuberculosis). A patient is expected to be free from all living TB bacteria after six months of therapy in Pulmonary TB or 8-10 months in Miliary TB. 34ba0539c2

The drug bindings occur by non-covalent bonds (e.g. Hydrogen bonds, electrostatic interactions, van der Waals forces) to some of the highly polymorphic T cell receptors for antigen (TCR) and / or human leukocyte antigens (HLA).

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The binding occurs mostly on the cell surface and is labile, reversible and transient. It interacts with the crucial molecules of antigen...

34ba0539c2 *M. pneumoniae* is known to cause a host of symptoms such as primary atypical pneumonia, tracheobronchitis, and upper respiratory tract disease. Primary atypical pneumonia is one of the most severe types of manifestation, with tracheobronchitis being the most common symptom and another 15% of cases, usually adults, remain asymptomatic.

Symptomatic infections tend to develop over a period of several days and manifestation of pneumonia can be confused with a number of other bacterial pathogens and conditions that cause pneumonia.

Tracheobronchitis is most common in children due to a reduced immune system capacity, and up to 18% of infected children require hospitalization. Common mild symptoms include sore throat, wheezing and coughing, fever,

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headache, rhinitis, myalgia and feelings of unease, in which symptom intensity and duration can be limited by early treatment with antibiotics. Rarely, *M. pneumoniae* pneumonia results... 34ba0539c2 Latent tuberculosis or latent tuberculosis infection (LTBI) is treated with three to nine months of isoniazid alone. This long-term treatment often risks the development of hepatotoxicity. A combination of isoniazid plus rifampicin for a period of three to four months is shown to be an equally effective method for treating LTBI, while mitigating risks to hepatotoxicity. Treatment of LTBI is essential in preventing the spread of active TB. 34ba0539c2 Kidney infections usually occurs when a bladder infection spreads, but may also come from bacteria in the blood. ORN occurs most commonly in the mouth during the treatment of head and neck cancer, and can arise over 5 years after radiation 34ba0539c2

Vaccines to prevent certain types of pneumonia (such as those caused by Streptococcus pneumoniae bacteria, influenza viruses, or SARS-CoV-2) are available. Other methods of prevention include hand washing to prevent infection, prompt treatment... 34ba0539c2

Lyme disease It is the most common disease spread by ticks in the Northern Hemisphere. develops, several antibiotics are effective, including doxycycline,

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amoxicillin and cefuroxime. Infections are most common in the spring and early summer. Most treated patients experience a full recovery. For some patients, recovery may not be immediate or complete, resulting in long-term effects. Early detection and prompt treatment are associated with more favorable outcomes. Standard treatment usually lasts for two or three weeks Lyme disease, also known as Lyme borreliosis, is a tick-borne disease caused by species of *Borrelia* bacteria, transmitted by blood-feeding ticks in the genus *Ixodes*. Infection is treatable with antibiotics 34ba0539c2

Pneumonia is usually caused by infection with viruses or bacteria, and less commonly by other microorganisms. Identifying the responsible pathogen can be difficult. Diagnosis is often based on symptoms and physical examination. Chest X-rays, blood tests, and culture of the sputum may help confirm the diagnosis.

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The disease may be classified by where it was acquired, such as community- or hospital-acquired or healthcare-associated pneumonia. 34ba0539c2

The most common cause of infection is E. coli, though other bacteria or fungi may sometimes be the cause. Risk factors include being female, sexual intercourse, diabetes, using a catheter, and family history. Additional factors that have been found to increase the risk of infection include urinary retention (delaying urination), insufficient water intake, use of spermicides as a contraceptive

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method, and poor genital hygiene.

34ba0539c2 The pathophysiology of ORN is fairly complex and involves drastic changes to bone tissue as a result of DNA damage and cell death caused by radiation treatment. Radiation therapy targeting tumor cells can affect normal cells as well, which can result in the death of bone tissue. Advances in radiation therapy have decreased the incidence of ORN, estimated at around 2%. Certain risk factors including the size and location of tumor, history of smoking or diabetes, and presence of dental disease can affect the chances of developing ORN.

34ba0539c2 In animals, erysipelas is a disease caused by infection with the bacterium *Erysipelothrix rhusiopathiae*. In animals, it is called diamond skin disease, and occurs especially in pigs. Heart valves and skin are affected. *E. rhusiopathiae* can also infect humans, but in that case, the infection is known as erysipeloid and is an occupational skin disease.

34ba0539c2 Erysipelas is

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usually caused by the bacterium *Streptococcus pyogenes*, also known as group A, β -hemolytic streptococci, which enters the body through a break in the skin, such as a scratch or an insect bite. It is more superficial than cellulitis and is typically more raised and demarcated. Risk factors for pneumonia include cystic fibrosis, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), sickle cell disease, asthma, diabetes, heart failure, a history of smoking, a poor ability to cough (such as following a stroke), and immunodeficiency. 34ba0539c2

Erysipelas It is a form of cellulitis and is potentially serious. with antibiotics; (amoxicillin/clavulanic acid, cefalexin, or cloxacillin) taken by mouth for five days, though sometimes longer. Because of the risk Erysipelas () is a relatively common bacterial infection of the superficial layer of the skin (upper dermis), extending to the superficial lymphatic vessels within

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the skin, characterized by a raised, well-defined, tender, bright-red rash, typically on the face or legs, but which can occur anywhere on the skin 34ba0539c2

The most common sign of infection is an expanding red rash, known as erythema migrans (EM), which appears at the site of the tick bite about a week afterwards. The rash is typically neither itchy nor painful. Approximately 70–80% of infected people develop a rash. Other early symptoms may include fever, headaches and tiredness. If untreated, symptoms may include loss of the ability to move one or both sides of the face, joint pains, severe headaches with neck stiffness or heart palpitations. Months to years later, repeated episodes of joint pain and swelling may occur. Occasionally, shooting pains or tingling in the arms and... 34ba0539c2

Pneumonia Research in children showed that a shorter, 3-day course of amoxicillin was as

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effective as a longer, 7-day course for treating pneumonia in this population. Pneumonia is an inflammatory condition of the lung primarily affecting the small air sacs known as alveoli. Symptoms typically include some combination of productive or dry cough, chest pain, fever, and difficulty breathing. The severity of the condition is variable. 34ba0539c2

Prior to the Vietnam war less than a handful of patients had diagnosed in the United States in the twentieth century. In 1966, Murray Spotnitz, M.D., the chief of Pulmonary Medicine at Valley Forge Army Hospital, discovered that a number of servicemen with delayed onset of pulmonary infections had previously been deployed in Vietnam. Spotnitz coined the term "Vietnam Time Bomb" to highlight the fact that *B. pseudomallei* could remain dormant for years. The term gained traction as subsequent studies revealed latent infections in Vietnam veterans with estimates

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suggesting up to 250,000 U.S. soldiers were exposed. Spotnitz was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross by President Lyndon Johnson at a White House ceremony. 34ba0539c2 Although gingivitis does not always progress to periodontitis, periodontitis is always preceded by gingivitis. 34ba0539c2

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
