Stopping the medication suddenly following long-term use may be dangerous. The cream commonly results in increased hair growth and skin irritation. Betamethasone belongs to the glucocorticoid class of medication. It is a stereoisomer of dexamethasone, the two compounds differing only in the spatial configuration of the methyl group at position 16 (see steroid nomenclature). e5f498fb41 Some common naturally occurring steroid hormones are cortisol (C₂₁H₃₀O₅), corticosterone (C₂₁H₃₀O₄), cortisone (C₂₁H₂₈O₅) and aldosterone (C₂₁H₂₈O₅) (cortisone and aldosterone are isomers). Dexamethasone The effects of dexamethasone are frequently seen within a day and last for about three days. In adrenocortical insufficiency, it may be used in

combination with a mineralocorticoid medication such as fludrocortisone. "Injected Corticosteroids for Plantar Heel Pain" Dexamethasone is a fluorinated glucocorticoid medication used to treat rheumatic problems, a number of skin diseases, severe allergies, asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), croup, brain swelling, eye pain following eye surgery, superior vena cava syndrome (a complication of some forms of cancer), and along with antibiotics in tuberculosis. It may be given by mouth, as an injection into a muscle, as an injection into a vein, as a topical cream or ointment for the skin or as a topical ophthalmic solution to the eye. More severe side effects include psychiatric problems, which may occur in about 5% of people. Common side effects with long-term use include bone loss, weakness, yeast infections, and easy bruising. While short-term use in the later part of pregnancy is safe, long-term use or use in early pregnancy is occasionally associated with harm to the baby. Injection (medicine) The occurrence of these side effects varies based on injection location, the substance injected, needle gauge, procedure, and individual An injection (often and usually referred to as a "shot" in US English, a "jab" in UK English, or a "jag" in Scottish English and Scots) is the act of administering a liquid, especially a drug, into a person's body using a needle (usually a hypodermic needle) and a syringe. There are many types of injection, which are generally named after the body tissue the injection is administered into. This allows the medication to be absorbed more rapidly and avoid the first pass effect. This includes common injections such as subcutaneous, intramuscular, and intravenous injections, as well as less common injections such as epidural, intraperitoneal, intraosseous, intracardiac, intraarticular, and intracavernous injections. An injection is considered a form of parenteral drug administration; it does not involve absorption in the digestive tract. or infection e5f498fb41

Corticosteroid Use of corticosteroids has numerous side-effects, some of which may be severe: Corticosteroids are a class of steroid hormones that are produced

in the adrenal cortex of vertebrates, and also their synthetic analogues. The two main classes of corticosteroids – glucocorticoids and mineralocorticoids – are involved in a wide range of physiological processes, including stress response, immune response, and regulation of inflammation, carbohydrate metabolism, protein catabolism, blood electrolyte levels, and behavior. the amount of corticosteroid medicine as children and teens using it daily e5f498fb41

Hydrocortisone Uses include conditions such as adrenocortical insufficiency, adrenogenital syndrome, high blood calcium, thyroiditis, rheumatoid arthritis, dermatitis, asthma, and COPD. There are even rare case reports of corticosteroid misuse, addiction Hydrocortisone is the name for the hormone cortisol when supplied as a medication. It can be given by mouth, topically, rectally or by injection. It is the treatment of choice for adrenocortical insufficiency. Stopping treatment after long-term use should be done slowly. It is a corticosteroid and works as an anti-inflammatory and by immune suppression. administration of high doses of corticosteroids is well-known to produce euphoria and mania e5f498fb41

Common side effects with long-term use include osteoporosis, cataracts, thrush, and muscle weakness. Serious side effects may include psychosis, increased risk of infections, adrenal suppression, and bronchospasm. Use in pregnancy is generally safe. It works by decreasing inflammation and immune system activity. e5f498fb41 The long-term use of dexamethasone may result in thrush, bone loss, cataracts, easy bruising, or muscle weakness. It is in pregnancy category C in the United States, meaning that it should only be used when the benefits are predicted to be greater than the risks. Epidural steroid injection It is of limited benefit but has infrequent major side effects. Triamcinolone The side effects of triamcinolone are similar to other corticosteroids. It is also used to prevent worsening of asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). In short-term treatment of up to ten days, it has very few adverse effects; however Triamcinolone is a glucocorticoid used to treat certain skin diseases, allergies, and rheumatic disorders among others. It can be taken in various ways including by mouth, injection into a muscle, and inhalation e5f498fb41
