Diastasis recti Umbilical hernia* *The condition can be diagnosed by physical exam, and must be differentiated from an epigastric hernia or incisional hernia, if the patient Diastasis recti, or rectus abdominis diastasis, is an increased gap between the right and left rectus abdominis muscles. While standard exercise can slow or prevent the complete healing of the separated muscles, safe core and pelvic floor exercise can improve or resolve the condition. Physical therapy is often successful in repairing this separation, and surgery is an option for more severe cases. This condition has no associated morbidity or mortality. The increased distance between the muscles is created by the stretching of the linea alba, a connective collagen sheath created by the aponeurosis insertions of the transverse abdominis, internal oblique, and external oblique 7ae7d7f40b

The female obturator foramen has been shown to have a triangular opening, while for males it is more oval-like. Childbirth has also been shown to cause multiple structural changes to the muscle, thereby increasing the risk of hernias forming with multiple childbirth. People with lean body builds are also more likely to develop an obturator hernia due to having less adipose and lymphatic tissue surrounding the obturator canal. Bowel resection Depending on which part and how much of the intestines are removed, there may be digestive and metabolic challenges afterward, such as short bowel syndrome. Complications of the procedure may include anastomotic leak or dehiscence, hernias, or adhesions causing partial or complete bowel obstruction. Depending on which part and how much of the intestines are A bowel resection or enterectomy (enter- + -ectomy) is a surgical procedure in which a part of an intestine (bowel) is removed, from either the small intestine or large intestine. Often the word enterectomy is reserved for the sense of small bowel resection, in distinction from colectomy, which covers the sense of large bowel resection. Some patients require ileostomy or colostomy after this procedure as alternative means of excretion

== Types == Groin hernias occur more often on the right than left side. The main concern is bowel strangulation, where the blood supply to part of the bowel is blocked. This usually produces severe pain and tenderness... There are two different clusters of hernia: groin and ventral (abdominal) wall. Groin hernia includes femoral, obturator, and inguinal. Inguinal hernia is the most common type of hernia and consist of about 75% of all hernia surgery cases in the US. Inguinal hernia, which results from lower abdominal wall weakness or defect, is more common among men with about 90% of total cases. In the inguinal hernia, fatty tissue or a part of the small intestine gets inserted into the inguinal canal. Other structures that are uncommon but may get stuck in inguinal hernia can be the appendix, caecum, and transverse colon. Hernias can be asymptomatic, incarcerated, or strangled. Incarcerated hernia leads to impairment of intestinal flow, and strangled hernia obstructs blood flow in addition to intestinal flow. Mendelson's syndrome is a type of chemical pneumonitis. The term

diaphragm in anatomy, created by Gerard of Cremona, can refer to other flat structures such as the urogenital diaphragm or pelvic diaphragm, but "the diaphragm" generally refers to the thoracic diaphragm. In humans, the diaphragm is slightly asymmetric—its right half is higher up (superior) to the left half, since the large liver rests beneath the right half of the diaphragm. Permanent meshes remain in the body, whereas temporary ones dissolve over time. One temporary mesh was shown in 2012 to fully dissolve after three years in a scientific trial on sheep. Some types of mesh combine permanent and temporary meshes which includes both resorbable vicryl, made from polyglycolic acid, and prolene, a non-resorbable polypropylene. Other mammals have diaphragms, and other vertebrates such as amphibians and reptiles have diaphragm-like structures, but important details of the anatomy...

Chemical pneumonitis is inflammation of the lung caused by aspirating or inhaling irritants. There are two general types of chemical pneumonitis: acute and chronic. It is sometimes called a "chemical pneumonia", though it is not infectious.

Surgical mesh can be made from both inorganic and biological materials and is used in a variety of surgeries, although hernia repair is the most common application. This may be performed. Surgical mesh (also called hernia mesh) is a medical implant made of loosely woven mesh, which is used in surgery as either a permanent or temporary structural support for organs and other tissues. It can also be used for reconstructive work, such as in pelvic organ prolapse or to repair physical defects (mainly of body cavity walls) created by extensive resections or traumatic tissue loss. In hernia surgery, an implanted mesh may be fixated to the surrounding tissue to prevent it from migrating.

Obturator hernia The obturator foramen is formed by a branch of the ischial (lower and back hip bone) as well as the pubic bone. An obturator hernia is a rare type of hernia, encompassing 0.07-1% of all hernias, of the pelvic floor in which pelvic or abdominal contents protrude. The canal is typically 2-3 centimeters long and 1 centimeter wide, creating a space for pouches of pre-peritoneal fat.

Diastasis of the rectus abdominis muscle occurs in the general population and is particularly common in certain groups. Studies have shown that there is a high prevalence in postpartum women, but that it can also occur in newborns and any adult woman or man.
