Phenolic content in wine This effect is particularly profound when drinking tannic wines without the benefit of food. This large group of natural phenols can be broadly separated into two categories, flavonoids and non-flavonoids. These compounds include phenolic acids, stilbenoids, flavonols, dihydroflavonols, anthocyanins (enocyanin), flavanol monomers (catechins) and flavanol polymers (proanthocyanidins). Flavonoids include the anthocyanins and tannins which contribute to the color and mouthfeel of the wine. These include a large group of several hundred chemical compounds that affect the taste, aroma, bouquet, color and mouthfeel of wine. Acidity fc827d2da9 The natural phenols are not evenly distributed within the grape. Phenolic acids are largely present in the pulp, anthocyanins and stilbenoids in the skin, and other phenols (catechins, proanthocyanidins and flavonols) in the skin and the seeds. Some white wine is also made from grapes with colored skin, provided that the obtained must is not stained. Pinot noir, for example, is commonly used to produce champagne. A Wine of Wizardry When the poem was first published in Cosmopolitan magazine in 1907 with an afterword by Ambrose Bierce it stimulated a nationwide controversy. The poem inspired Clark Ashton Smith to become a poet and influenced other writers as well. after drinking a cup of wine. [Actually, the visions were seen not by Sterling, but by his unnamed narrator. It was reprinted again several times, and has been imitated and parodied by many writers, including Sterling himself. And the narrator did not sip the wine before "A Wine of Wizardry" is a fantasy-horror poem by George Sterling written in 1903 and 1904. The poem was reprinted in Sterling's 1908 collection A Wine of Wizardry and Other Poems. It was both critically praised and condemned

Wine tasting descriptors The primary source of a person's ability to taste wine is derived from their olfactory senses. Fat: a wine that is full in body and has The use of wine tasting descriptors allows the taster to qualitatively relate the aromas and flavors that the taster experiences and can be used in assessing the overall quality of wine. A taster's own personal experiences play a significant role in conceptualizing what they are tasting and attaching a description to that perception. The individual nature of tasting means that descriptors may be perceived differently among various tasters. past its peak (or optimal) drinking period and is rapidly declining in quality is said to have "fallen over". Wine writers differentiate wine tasters from casual enthusiasts; tasters attempt to give an objective description of the wine's taste (often taking a systematic approach to tasting), casual enthusiasts appreciate wine but pause their examination sooner than tasters

A proper balance of acidity must be struck with the other elements of a wine, or else the wine may be said to be too sharp - having disproportionately high levels of acidity - or too flat - having disproportionately low levels of acidity. The three main acids found in wine are tartaric acid, malic acid and lactic acid. The first two come from the grapes and the third from Malolactic fermentation which often occurs in the winemaking process. fc827d2da9
