Benzocetamine alpha-adrenergic antagonist, does not reduce blood pressure through a serotonin mechanism but does reduce blood pressure by antagonizing alpha-adrenergic Benzocetamine is a drug that possesses sedative and anxiolytic properties. However, when co-administered with other drugs that cause respiratory depression, like morphine, it can cause increased respiratory depression. As a result, when compared to other sedative and anxiolytic drugs such as benzodiazepines like diazepam, it is a safer form of tranquilizing. Marketed as Tacitin by Ciba-Geigy, it is different from most sedative drugs because in most clinical trials it does not produce respiratory depression, but actually stimulates the respiratory system 0d0871f42b

Its anxiolytic effects are most similar to diazepam, another anxiolytic, but unlike diazepam, benzocetamine has antagonistic effects on epinephrine and norepinephrine, and appears to increase serotonin levels. While little is understood about how it carries out its effects, studies point to reduced serotonin, epinephrine, and norepinephrine as partial causes of its pharmacologic and behavioral effects. 0d0871f42b == Medical uses == 0d0871f42b Common side effects include low blood pressure with standing, dizziness, feeling tired, and nausea. Serious side effects may include low blood pressure, liver problems, heart failure, and bronchospasm. Hives Fewer than 5% of cases last for more than six weeks (a condition known as chronic urticaria). This includes essential hypertension, hypertensive emergencies, and hypertension of pregnancy. It can be given by mouth or by injection into a vein. 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Animal studies showed some signs of potential trouble for women who are pregnant, and it has not been tested in women who are pregnant. Other serious side effects include bronchial spasm. Use is not recommended during pregnancy and alternative drugs are preferred when breastfeeding. Treatment is typically with antihistamines, with the second generation antihistamines such as fexofenadine, loratadine and cetirizine being preferred due to less risk of sedation and cognitive impairment. Anxiolytic Anxiolytic medications are used for the treatment of anxiety disorders and their related psychological and physical symptoms. Over the last 40 years, a variety of drugs have been developed from non-selective alpha-1 receptor antagonists to selective alpha-1 antagonists and alpha-1 receptor inverse agonists. The first drug that was used was a non-selective alpha blocker, named phenoxybenzamine and was used to treat BPH. Currently, several relatively selective alpha-1 antagonists are available. As of 2018, prazosin is the only alpha-1 blocker known to act as an inverse agonist at all alpha-1 adrenergic receptor subtypes; whereas tamsulosin and terazosin are both selective antagonists for all alpha-1

subtypes. Tamsulosin is not centrally active due to poor blood-brain barrier penetration, but terazosin... 0d0871f42b In the United States, lofexidine is approved for the "mitigation of withdrawal symptoms to facilitate abrupt discontinuation of opioids in adults," for a treatment duration of 14 days. In the United Kingdom, lofexidine is commonly used in conjunction with the opioid receptor antagonist naltrexone in rapid detoxification cases. When these two drugs are paired, naltrexone is administered to induce an opioid receptor blockade, causing the patient to experience rapid onset of opioid withdrawal and accelerating the detoxification process, while lofexidine is given to relieve the symptoms associated with the withdrawal including chills, sweating, stomach cramps, muscle pain, and runny nose. 0d0871f42b Atenolol was patented in 1969 and approved for medical use in 1975. It is on the World Health Organization's List of Essential Medicines. It is available as a generic medication. Alpha blockers can treat a small range of diseases such as hypertension, Raynaud's disease, benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH) and erectile dysfunction. Generally speaking, these treatments function by binding an α -blocker to α receptors in the arteries and smooth muscle.
