Parboiling reduces toxicity; drying converts ibotenic acid into muscimol while retaining psychoactive effects. Some cultures use it as food after preparation. The fermentation of tea leaves alters their chemistry, affecting the organoleptic qualities of the tea made from them. Fermentation affects the smell of the tea and typically mellows its taste, reducing astringency and bitterness while improving mouthfeel and aftertaste. The microbes may also produce metabolites with health benefits. Additionally, substances like ethyl carbamate (urethane) may be produced. The lingzhi mushroom is used in traditional Chinese medicine. The exact species of the mushrooms, their active constituents, and their mechanism of action have all yet to be fully clarified. However, among the most frequently implicated species is *Lanmaoa asiatica*, a species first described in 2015. The gills produce microscopic spores which help the fungus spread across the ground or its occupant surface. Kombucha is believed to have originated in China, where the drink is regionally traditional. While it is named after the Japanese term for kelp tea in English, the two drinks have no relation. By the early 20th century kombucha spread to Russia, then other parts of Eastern Europe and Germany. Kombucha is now homebrewed globally, and also bottled and sold commercially. The global kombucha market was worth approximately US\$1.7 billion as of 2019.

Pu'er tea which is a specific variety of tea plant that is native to Yunnan. 'black tea', though the term is commonly translated to English as "dark tea" to distinguish it from the English-language "black tea" (红茶; 红; hóngchá; 'red tea'), which it is not. In the context of traditional Chinese tea production terminology, fermentation refers to microbial fermentation (called 'wet piling'), and is typically applied after the tea leaves have been sufficiently dried and rolled.
