Mid-level practitioner The legal scope of practice for mid-level practitioners varies greatly among jurisdictions, with some having a restricted and well-defined scope, while others have a scope similar to that of a physician. Mid-level practitioners, also called non-physician practitioners, advanced practice providers, or commonly mid-levels, are health care providers who assess, diagnose, and treat patients but do not have formal education or certification as a physician. Some mid-level practitioners work under the close supervision of a physician (such as doing pre-op and post-op assessment and management, thus allowing surgeons to spend more of their time operating), while others function independently and have a scope of practice difficult to distinguish from a physician. The scope of a mid-level practitioner varies greatly among countries and even among individual practitioners. Likewise, the training requirement for mid-level

practitioners varies greatly between and within different certifications and licensures. physician assistant, these clinicians are described as “dependent practitioners”, meaning that they require supervision at all times by a physician

Physician-scientist Physician-scientists traditionally hold both a medical degree and a Doctor of Philosophy, also known as an MD-PhD. A physician-scientist (in North American English) or clinician-scientist (in British English and Australian English) is a physician who divides their professional time between direct clinical practice with patients and scientific research. However, since the 1950s, family medicine has become a specialty in its own right, with specific training requirements tailored to each country. It is based on knowledge of the patient in the context of the family and the community, focusing on disease prevention and health promotion. Historically, the role of Family doctors was once performed by any doctor with qualifications from a medical school and who worked in the community. The specialist, who is usually a primary care physician, is called a family physician.
