Management of chronic headaches Chronic headaches consist of different sub-groups, primarily categorized as chronic tension-type headaches and chronic migraine headaches. Medicinal and non-medicinal methods exist to help patients cope with chronic headache, because chronic headaches cannot be cured. Multiple sources recommend multimodal treatment, which is a combination of medicinal and non-medicinal remedies. Another medication to prevent headaches is botulinum toxin type A (BoNTA or BOTOX), which is given by injection instead of being taken orally. It is estimated that chronic headaches affect "4% to 5% of the general population". Suggested treatments for chronic headaches include medication, physical therapy, acupuncture, relaxation training, and biofeedback. In a clinical Chronic headache, or chronic daily headache (CDH), is classified as experiencing fifteen or more days with a headache per month. Some treatments are controversial and are still being tested for effectiveness. The treatments for chronic headache are vast and varied. In addition, dietary alteration and behavioral therapy or psychological therapy are other possible treatments for chronic headaches. Whether pharmacological or not, treatment plans are often created on an individual basis f9ecd85f88

Vaginismus Estimates of how common Vaginismus is a condition in which involuntary muscle spasm interferes with vaginal intercourse or other penetration of the vagina. toxin (botox), a muscle spasm treatment, is being studied. Often it begins when vaginal intercourse is first attempted. This often results in pain with attempts at sex. There are no epidemiological studies of the prevalence of vaginismus. Botulism The disease. potentially fatal illness caused by botulinum toxin (commonly referred to as botox), which is produced by the bacterium Clostridium botulinum f9ecd85f88

Embouchure collapse Treatments using botox have been pioneered to treat focal dystonia in other parts of the body; Embouchure collapse, "blowing one's chops" is a generic term used by wind instrument players to describe a variety of conditions which result in the inability of the embouchure to function. In brass playing, it involves vibration of the membrane area of the lips. in terms of brass playing at least, no effective cure. The embouchure is the purposeful arrangement of the facial muscles and lips to produce a sound on a wind or brass instrument f9ecd85f88

== Causes == f9ecd85f88 There are a variety of causes for embouchure collapse, mainly focal dystonia or Embouchure Overuse Syndrome; also, the topic of mouthpiece pressure (whether or not excessive pressure is damaging to the embouchure) is hotly debated by brass players. f9ecd85f88 Recent research, however, suggests eyebrows in humans developed as a means of communication and that this is their primary function. In humans, eyebrows serve two main functions: first, prevention of sweat, water, and other debris from falling down into the eye socket, and second, communication through facial expression. eye lift.
