Regions of Wales Presently, the most common form of division of Wales into "regions" has been using cardinal and intercardinal references: north or south-west for example. Wales is most commonly sub-divided into between two and four regions, with a North-South divide, and North, Mid, South East and South West division being common. This includes devolved institutions, such as Visit Wales, Natural Resources Wales, and the Welsh Government itself, using different sets of Wales' regions. Various organisations use different regions and combinations of regions for their individual purposes. None of the variously described "regions" have official status or defined boundaries; neither is there a fixed number of regions. Initially, the ITLs were a mirror to the pre-existing NUTS system, they retained the same three level hierarchy and boundaries used for NUTS in the United Kingdom from 2018. ITLs were set to follow a similar review timetable to NUTS, being reviewed every three years. The ONS developed new official GSS codes of ITL geography aligned with the existing NUTS codes.
