Sodium sulfide It is commonly supplied as a crystalline mass, in flake form, or as a fused solid. They are water-soluble, giving strongly alkaline solutions. Both the anhydrous and the hydrated salts are colorless solids, although technical grades of sodium sulfide are generally yellow to brick red owing to the presence of polysulfides. When exposed to moisture, Na₂S is immediately hydrolyzed to give sodium hydrosulfide. Sodium sulfide has an unpleasant rotten egg smell due to the formation of hydrogen sulfide by hydrolysis in moist air. More common is its hydrate Na₂S·9H₂O. atmosphere. When heated with oxygen and carbon dioxide, sodium sulfide can oxidize to sodium carbonate and sulfur dioxide: $2 \text{Na}_2\text{S} + 3 \text{O}_2 + 2 \text{CO}_2 \rightarrow 2 \text{Na}_2\text{CO}_3$ Sodium sulfide is a chemical compound with the formula Na₂S 23b9c90564

Glasses derived from lithium carbonate are useful in ovenware. Lithium carbonate is a common ingredient in both low-fire and high-fire ceramic glaze. It forms low-melting fluxes with silica and other materials. Its alkaline properties are conducive to changing the state of metal oxide colorants in glaze, particularly red iron oxide (Fe₂O₃). Cement sets more rapidly when prepared with lithium carbonate, and is useful for tile adhesives. When added to aluminium trifluoride, it forms LiF which yields a superior electrolyte for the processing of aluminium. 23b9c90564

Supplementation is generally only required when there is not enough calcium in the diet.
