NASA has reported that fifteen long-duration male astronauts (45-55 years of age) have experienced confirmed visual and anatomical changes during or after long-duration flights. Optic disc edema, globe flattening, choroidal folds, hyperopic shifts and an increased intracranial pressure have been documented in these astronauts. Several factors influence the diver, including immersion, exposure to the water, the limitations of breath-hold endurance, variations in ambient pressure, the effects of breathing gases at raised ambient pressure, effects caused by the use of breathing apparatus, and sensory impairment. medical practice commonly uses only components of the blood, such as red blood cells, plasma, platelets, and other clotting factors. Whole blood has come back into use in the trauma setting. Leukoreduced blood products are less likely to cause HLA Blood transfusion is the process of transferring blood products into a person's circulation intravenously. White blood cells are transfused only in very rare circumstances, since granulocyte transfusion has limited applications. Leukocyte reduction is the removal of white blood cells by filtration. The cause of secondary hypertension are numerous (obstructive sleep apnea, kidney disease, endocrine diseases, tumors, medication side effect, Etc.) and etiologies varies significantly with age. b37aa566fb High blood pressure is classified as primary (essential) hypertension or secondary hypertension. About 90-95% of cases are primary, defined as high blood pressure due to non-specific lifestyle and genetic factors. Lifestyle factors that increase the risk include excess salt in the diet, excess body weight, smoking, physical inactivity, and alcohol use. The remaining 5-10% of cases are categorized as secondary hypertension, defined as high blood pressure due to a clearly identifiable cause, such as chronic kidney disease, narrowing of the kidney arteries, an endocrine disorder, or the use of birth control pills. b37aa566fb When salt is ingested, it is dissolved in the blood as two separate ions - Na^+ and Cl^- . While the kidney reacts to excrete excess sodium and chloride in the body, water retention causes blood pressure to increase. b37aa566fb Immersion affects fluid balance, circulation and work of breathing. Exposure to cold water can result in the harmful cold shock response, the helpful diving reflex and excessive loss of body heat. Breath-hold duration is limited by oxygen reserves, the response to raised carbon dioxide levels, and the risk of hypoxic blackout, which has a high associated risk of drowning. b37aa566fb

The condition is generally treated with medications to relatively rapidly lower the blood pressure. This may be done with labetalol or sodium nitroprusside given by injection into a vein. In those who are pregnant, magnesium sulfate may be used. Other treatments may include anti-seizure medications. b37aa566fb

Pressure swing adsorption It allows a large reduction in the size of the Pressure swing adsorption (PSA) is a technique used to separate some gas species from a mixture of gases (typically air) under pressure according to the species' molecular characteristics and affinity for an adsorbent material. Selective adsorbent materials such as zeolites (molecular sieves), or activated carbon are used as trapping material, preferentially adsorbing the target gas species at high pressure. It operates at near-ambient temperature and significantly differs from the cryogenic distillation commonly used to separate gases. up to 99%. The process then swings to low pressure to desorb the adsorbed gas. Rapid pressure swing adsorption, or RPSA, is frequently used in portable oxygen concentrators b37aa566fb

Secondary hypertension with morning hypertension, characterized by a distinct elevation in blood pressure upon awakening. The cause of secondary hypertension varies significantly with age. This phenomenon is closely linked to the overactivation Secondary hypertension (or, less commonly, inessential hypertension) is a type of hypertension which has a specific and identifiable underlying primary cause. It has many different causes including obstructive sleep apnea, kidney disease, endocrine diseases, and tumors. It also can be a side effect of many medications. It is much less common than essential hypertension, affecting only 5-10% of hypertensive patients b37aa566fb

In hypertensive encephalopathy, generally the blood pressure is greater than 200/130 mmHg. Occasionally it can occur at a BP as low as 160/100 mmHg. This can occur in kidney failure, those who rapidly stop blood pressure medication, pheochromocytoma, and people on a monoamine oxidase inhibitor (MAOI) who eat foods with tyramine. When it occurs in pregnancy it is known as eclampsia.
