The GDI is often considered a "gender-sensitive extension of the HDI" (Klasen 245). It addresses gender gaps... GDI, together with the Gender Empowerment Measure (GEM), was introduced in 1995 in the Human Development Report written by the United Nations Development Program. These measurements aimed to add a gender-sensitive dimension to the Human Development Index (HDI). The first measurement that they created was the Gender Development Index (GDI). The GDI is defined as a "distribution-sensitive measure that accounts for the human development impact of existing gender gaps in the three components of the HDI" (Klasen 243). Distribution sensitivity means that the GDI takes into account not only the average or general level of well-being and wealth within a given country but focuses also on how this wealth and well-being is distributed between different groups within society. The HDI and the GDI (as well as the GEM) were created to rival the more traditional general income-based measures of development such as gross domestic product (GDP) and gross national product (GNP). == Methods of accounting == In development geography, geographers study spatial patterns in development. Gross domestic product Dividing total GDP by the population gives an idealized rough measure of GDP per capita. A country may rank high in GDP but still experience jobless growth depending on its planned economic structure and strategies. The major components of GDP are consumption, government spending, net exports (exports minus imports), and investment. Changing any of these factors can increase the size of the economy. However, GDP is not a measure of overall standard of living or well-being, as it does not account for how income is distributed among the population. Several national and international economic organizations, such as the OECD and the International Monetary Fund, maintain their own definitions of GDP. GDP is often used to measure the economic activity of a country or region. of countries by largest historical GDP Real GDP can be used to calculate the GDP growth rate, which indicates how much a country's production has increased Gross domestic product (GDP) is a monetary measure of the total market value of all of the final goods and services which are produced and rendered during a specific period of time (usually a year) by a country or countries.
