Proximal tubule The proximal tubule The proximal tubule is the segment of the nephron in kidneys which begins from the renal (tubular) pole of the Bowman's capsule to the beginning of loop of Henle. At this location, the glomerular parietal epithelial cells (PECs) lining bowman's capsule abruptly transition to proximal tubule epithelial cells (PTECs). the glomerular parietal epithelial cells (PECs) lining bowman's capsule abruptly transition to proximal tubule epithelial cells (PTECs). Transitional epithelium Transitional epithelium lines all Transitional epithelium, also known as urothelium is a type of stratified epithelium that changes shape in response to stretching. Transitional epithelium lines all of the organs of the urinary system – the kidneys, ureters, bladder, and the urethra, hence its alternative name of urothelium. The bladder, for example, has a need for great distension. This tissue consists of multiple layers of epithelial cells which can contract and expand in order to adapt to the degree of distension needed. Urinary system Following filtration of blood and further processing, the ureters transport urine from the kidneys into the urinary bladder. The purpose of the urinary system is to eliminate urine from the body, regulate blood volume and blood pressure, control levels of electrolytes and metabolites, and regulate blood pH. The kidneys have an extensive blood supply via the renal arteries which leave the kidneys via the renal vein. Unlike the epithelial lining of most organs, transitional epithelium can flatten and distend The urinary system, also known as the urinary

tract or renal system, is a part of the excretory system of vertebrates. The female and male urinary system are very similar, differing only in the length of the urethra, which transports urine from the bladder through the penis or vulva during urination. lining called urothelium, a type of transitional epithelium. In humans and placental mammals, it consists of the kidneys, ureters, bladder, and the urethra. Each kidney consists of functional units called nephrons 4b1099e309

Urinalysis Three types may occur in urine: squamous epithelial cells, transitional epithelial cells and renal tubular epithelial cells. Macroscopic examination targets parameters such as color, clarity, odor, and specific gravity; urine test strips measure chemical properties such as pH, glucose concentration, and protein levels; and microscopy is performed to identify elements such as cells, urinary casts, crystals, and organisms. Transitional cell carcinoma chromosomal abnormality in transitional cell carcinoma, being present in its malignant cells in most cases of the disease. It is the most common type of bladder

cancer and cancer of the ureter, urethra, and urachus. Diagnosis includes urine analysis and imaging of the urinary tract (cystoscopy). Transitional cell bladder carcinomas Transitional cell carcinoma is a type of cancer that arises from the transitional epithelium, a tissue lining the inner surface of certain hollow organs. Symptoms of urothelial carcinoma in the bladder include hematuria (blood in the urine). It typically occurs in the urothelium of the urinary system; in that case, it is also called urothelial carcinoma 4b1099e309

== Background == 4b1099e309 It accounts for 95% of bladder cancer cases and bladder cancer is in the top 10 most common malignancy disease in the world and is associated with approximately 200,000 deaths per year in the United States alone. It is the second most common type of kidney cancer, but accounts for only five to 10 percent of all primary renal malignant tumors. Men and older people have a higher rate of urothelial carcinomas. Other risk factors include smoking and exposure to aromatic amines. 4b1099e309

Collecting duct system primarily of principal cells and α -intercalated cells. The simple columnar epithelium of the collecting duct system transitions into urothelium near the The collecting duct system of the kidney consists of a series of tubules and ducts that physically connect nephrons to a minor calyx or directly to the renal pelvis. The collecting duct participates in electrolyte and

fluid balance through reabsorption and excretion, processes regulated by the hormones aldosterone and vasopressin (antidiuretic hormone) 4b1099e309

== Signs and symptoms == 4b1099e309 == Structure == 4b1099e309 The external urethral sphincter is a striated muscle that allows voluntary control over urination. The internal urethral sphincter, formed by the involuntary smooth muscles lining the bladder neck and urethra, is innervated by the sympathetic division of the autonomic nervous system in males and females. 4b1099e309 The appearance of transitional epithelium differs according to its cell layer. Cells of the basal layer are cuboidal (cube-shaped), or columnar (column-shaped), while the cells of the superficial layer vary in appearance depending on the degree of distension. These cells appear to be cuboidal with a domed apex when the organ or the tube in which they reside is not stretched. When the organ or tube is stretched (such as when the bladder is filled with urine), the tissue compresses and the cells become stretched. When this happens, the cells flatten, and they appear to be squamous and irregular... 4b1099e309 The most distinctive characteristic of the proximal tubule is its luminal brush border. 4b1099e309

Decoy cells Koss. Decoy cells are virally infected epithelial cells that can be found in the urine. Leopold G. During the 1950s, cytotechnologist Andrew Ricci observed cells mimicking cancer

cells by they were not, in a group of persons working in some kinds of industries - they were referred to as “decoy cells”, analogous to “decoy ducks” used in hunting wild ducks, by Andrew Ricci, a cytotechnologist working under renowned cytopathologist Dr. Decoy cells owe their name to their strong resemblance to cancer cells, and may as such confuse the diagnosis of either viral infection or urothelial malignancy. The urethra is a fibrous and muscular tube which connects the urinary bladder to the external urethral meatus. Its length differs between the sexes, because it passes through the penis in males. Healthy humans normally produce 800–2,000 milliliters (mL) of urine every day. This amount varies according to fluid intake and kidney function. == Structure == Signs and symptoms == The most frequent symptoms of transitional cell carcinoma are blood in the urine, painful urination, frequent urination and/or straining to urinate. This can look very similar to an infection of the urinary system. Decoy cells are mostly prevalent in immunocompromised individuals, such as transplant recipients who are treated with immunosuppressive medication in order for their immune system not to reject the foreign transplanted organ. Several viruses mediated the emergence of decoy

cells, amongst which cytomegalovirus and polyomavirus. Decoy cells are virus infected urothelial cells with a distinct morphology of enlarged nuclei and intranuclear inclusions.
