The name troy is first attested in 1390, describing the

Troy weight By far the most common troy unit is the troy ounce (oz t), the standard mass unit Troy weight is a system of units of mass whose origin is uncertain. The troy weight units are the grain, the pennyweight (24 grains), the troy ounce (20 pennyweights), and the troy pound (12 troy ounces). The troy grain is equal to the grain unit of the avoirdupois and apothecaries' systems, but the troy ounce is heavier than the avoirdupois ounce, and the troy pound is lighter than the avoirdupois pound.
