This is known as dismissing or bowling out the batting team, who are said to be all out. A team's innings ends if ten of the eleven team members are dismissed. Other terms used are the batsman being out, the batting side losing a wicket, and the fielding side (and often the bowler) taking a wicket. The location of Old Comiskey's home plate is indicated by a marble plaque on the sidewalk next to Rate Field, with the foul lines painted in the parking lot.
