As obligate carnivores, cats require animal-based proteins for essential nutrients such as taurine and arginine, which they cannot synthesize from plant-based sources. By the late 19th century, commercial cat food emerged, with companies like Spratt's offering ready-made products to replace boiled horse meat

The breed was one of the most popular cat breeds in Europe and North America in the 19th century. From the 1980s onwards, the traditional "old-style" (rounder-built) cats started to officially split off from the (modern-style) Siamese breed and were re-established by multiple registries as the separate Thai cat breed. Cat intelligence is evident in its ability to adapt, learn through observation, and solve problems. The domestic cat is the only domesticated species of the family Felidae. Colourpoint patterns are where the extremities (paws, face, ears and tail) of the animal are coloured differently compared to the rest of the body. The areas with different colour may be referred as 'points' or being 'pointed'. Colour can spread to the rest of the body, but is concentrated on the extremities. Cats can use a range of communication methods, including vocal, visual, tactile and olfactory communication. Up to 21 different cat vocalizations have been observed. They use visual signals, or body language, to express emotions like relaxation, fear, and aggression. Cats use several types of tactile behaviors to communicate, such as grooming or biting each other. They also use olfactory communication, such as marking their territory via urine. If the body is unable to maintain a normal temperature and it increases significantly above normal, a condition known as hyperthermia occurs. Humans may experience lethal hyperthermia when the wet bulb temperature is sustained above 35 °C (95 °F) for six hours. Work in 2022 established by experiment that a wet-bulb temperature exceeding 30.55 °C caused uncompensable heat stress in young, healthy adult humans. The opposite condition, when body temperature decreases below normal levels, is known as hypothermia. It results when the homeostatic control mechanisms of heat within the body malfunction... Cat communication Studies have shown that domestic cats tend to meow much more than feral cats. When cats communicate with humans, they do so to get what they need or want, such as food, water, attention, or play. They rarely meow to communicate with fellow cats or other animals. This is common in multi-cat households. Additionally, they collaborate, play, and share resources. Cats can socialize with each other and are known to form "social ladders", where a dominant cat leads a few lesser cats. As such, cat communication methods have been significantly altered by domestication. Siamese cat Siamese cats have a distinctive colourpoint coat, resulting from a temperature-sensitive type of albinism. It is selectively bred since the end of the 19th-century from the Wichianmat landrace, one of several varieties of cats native to Thailand (known as Siam before 1939), and is pedigreed in all major cat fancier and breeder organisations. Distinct features like blue almond-shaped eyes, a triangular wedged head shape, large wide-set ears, an elongated, slender, and muscular body, and various colours of point colouration characterise the breed. If the body is unable to maintain a normal temperature and it increases significantly above normal, a condition known as hyperthermia Thermoregulation is the ability of an organism to keep its body temperature within certain boundaries, even when the surrounding temperature is very different.
