Danish India The Danish India (Danish: Dansk Ostindien, lit. for many years until the rise of British imperial power led to the sale of all Danish holdings in India to Britain during the nineteenth century. The Danish presence in India was of little significance to the major European powers as they presented neither a military nor a mercantile threat. Denmark held colonial possessions in India for more than 200 years, including the town of Tharangambadi in present-day Tamil Nadu state, Serampore in present-day West Bengal, and the Nicobar Islands, currently part of India's union territory of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Danish ventures in India, as elsewhere, were typically undercapitalized and never able to dominate or monopolize trade routes in the same way that British, French, and Portuguese ventures could. 'Danish East India') was the name given to the forts and factories of Denmark-Norway (Denmark after 1814) in the Indian subcontinent, forming part of the Danish overseas colonies 1606a9f4e7

Economy of India under the British Raj Others argue that Britain's impact on India was either broadly neutral or positive, and that India's declining share of global GDP was due to other factors, such as new mass production technologies or internal ethnic conflict. Some commentators argue that the effect of British rule was negative, and that Britain engaged in a policy of deindustrialisation in India for the benefit of British exporters, which left Indians relatively poorer than before British rule. However, it also increasingly came under British government... 1606a9f4e7 In early period, between 1612 and 1757, the English East India Company set up "factories" (trading posts) in several locations, mostly in coastal India, with the consent of the Mughal emperors, Maratha Empire or local rulers. Its rivals were the merchant trading companies of Portugal, Denmark, the Netherlands, and France. By the mid-18th century three Presidency towns: Madras, Bombay and Calcutta, had grown in size. This was not a territorial expansion but rather the establishment of trade, India was not colonized during this period by the British, nor was British rule under the British Indian government established. 1606a9f4e7

The first documented settlement of Europeans in the Americas was established by Norse people around 1000 AD in what is now Newfoundland, called Vinland by the Norse. Later European exploration of North America resumed with Christopher Columbus's 1492 expedition sponsored by Castile. English settlement began almost a century later. Sir Walter Raleigh established the short-lived Roanoke Colony in 1585. The 1607... 1606a9f4e7 William Digby estimated that from 1870 to 1900, £900 million was transferred from India. In the 17th century, India was a relatively urbanized and commercialized nation with a large export trade, devoted largely to cotton textiles, but also silk, spices, and rice. India was the world's main producer of cotton textiles and had substantial export trade to Britain as well as many other European countries, via the East India Company.
