In the early 20th century, communities began to install drinking water treatment systems, but control of the principal pollution sources—domestic sewage, industry, and agriculture—was not effectively regulated in the US until the 1970s. Multiple pollution incidents such as the Kingston Fossil Plant coal fly ash slurry spill (2008) and the Deepwater Horizon oil spill (2010) have left lasting impacts on water quality, ecosystems, and public health in the United States. Agricultural production relies heavily on the use of natural and synthetic fertilizers. These often contain high levels of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium. When nitrogen and phosphorus are not fully used by the growing plants, they are lost from the farm fields and negatively impact air and downstream water quality. These nutrients can end up in aquatic ecosystems and contribute to increased eutrophication. Water pollution Water bodies include lakes, rivers, oceans, aquifers, reservoirs and groundwater. Another is spreading water-borne diseases when people use polluted water for drinking or irrigation. Contaminants can come from one of four main sources. One is the degradation of aquatic ecosystems. Water pollution results when contaminants mix with these water bodies. Water pollution also reduces the ecosystem services such as drinking water provided by the water resource. Water pollution may affect either surface water or groundwater. These are sewage discharges, industrial activities, agricultural activities, and urban runoff including stormwater. Groundwater pollution Groundwater pollution can occur from on-site sanitation systems, landfill leachate, effluent from wastewater treatment plants, leaking sewers, petrol filling stations, hydraulic fracturing (fracking), or from over application of fertilizers in agriculture. Pollution (or contamination) can also occur from naturally occurring contaminants, such as arsenic or fluoride. This type of water pollution can also occur naturally due to the presence of a minor and unwanted constituent, contaminant, or impurity in the groundwater, in which case it is more likely referred to as contamination rather than pollution. Using polluted groundwater causes hazards to public health through poisoning or the spread of disease (water-borne diseases). This type of water pollution can also occur naturally due to the presence of a minor and unwanted constituent, contaminant, or impurity in the groundwater Groundwater pollution (also called groundwater contamination) occurs when pollutants are released to the ground and make their way into groundwater d1a133619d

The pollutant often produces a contaminant plume within an aquifer. Movement of water and dispersion within the aquifer spreads the pollutant over a wider area.
