In 1871 the Trinidad correspondent of The Gardeners' Chronicle said bananas were the only export of Aspinwall (Colón, Panama). The trade was mainly confined to four merchants. They sent the fruit by American steamers, known to the people as banana boats, which carried five to six thousand bunches on each trip. Plantations were around 7 miles (11 km) or 8 miles (13 km) from the town, and annually the merchants contracted sole rights with growers to take their entire crop at a set price per bunch, delivered to the side of the railroad. When a steamer was sighted, the farms were alerted to prepare and, once the merchant had confirmed how many bunches it could take, his agents went to contracted farms telling each how many thousand bunches it was to provide.
