Losartan/hydrochlorothiazide It consists of losartan, an angiotensin II receptor blocker; and hydrochlorothiazide, a thiazide diuretic. taken by mouth. Serious side effects may include low blood pressure Losartan/hydrochlorothiazide, sold under the brand name Hyzaar among others, is a fixed-dose combination medication used to treat high blood pressure when losartan is not sufficient. Treatment includes a healthy diet, salt restriction, and exercise. The medication acetazolamide may also be used along with the above measures. History of hypertension Bright noted a link between cardiac hypertrophy and kidney disease, and subsequently kidney disease was often termed Bright's disease in this period. Samuel Wilks observed that left ventricular hypertrophy and diseased arteries were not necessarily associated with diseased kidneys, implying that high blood pressure might occur in people. William Senhouse Kirkes in 1855 and Ludwig Traube in 1856 also proposed, based on pathological observations, that elevated pressure could account for the association between left ventricular hypertrophy to kidney damage in Bright's disease. In 1850 George Johnson suggested that the thickened blood vessels seen in the kidney in Bright's disease might be an adaptation to elevated blood pressure. Descriptions of what would come to be called hypertension came from, among others, Thomas Young in 1808 and especially Richard Bright in 1836. The first chemical for hypertension, sodium thiocyanate, was used in 1900 but had many side effects and was unpopular. blood pressure). The English clergyman Stephen Hales made the first published measurement of blood pressure in 1733. Other treatments, The modern history of hypertension begins with the understanding of the cardiovascular system based on the work of physician William Harvey (1578–1657), who described the circulation of blood in his book De motu cordis 8f73fe9269

The cause is often unknown. Risk factors include a family history, prior pulmonary embolism (blood clots in the lungs), HIV/AIDS, sickle cell disease, cocaine use, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, sleep apnea, living at high altitudes, and problems with the mitral valve. The underlying mechanism typically involves inflammation and subsequent remodeling of the arteries in the lungs. Diagnosis involves first ruling out other potential causes. It is much less common than essential hypertension, affecting only 5-10% of hypertensive patients. The cause of secondary hypertension varies significantly with age. It has many different causes including obstructive sleep apnea, kidney disease, endocrine diseases, and tumors 8f73fe9269

High blood pressure is classified as primary (essential) hypertension or secondary hypertension. About 90–95% of cases are primary, defined as high blood pressure due to non-specific lifestyle and genetic factors. Lifestyle factors that increase the risk include excess salt in the diet, excess body weight, smoking, physical inactivity, and alcohol use. The remaining 5–10% of cases are categorized as secondary hypertension, defined as high blood pressure due to a clearly identifiable cause, such as chronic kidney disease, narrowing of the kidney arteries, an endocrine disorder, or the use of birth control pills. 8f73fe9269 The combination is indicated for the treatment of hypertension, to lower blood pressure; and for the reduction of the risk of stroke in people with hypertension and left ventricular hypertrophy. 8f73fe9269 The combination was approved for medical use in the United States in 1995. It is available as a generic medication.
