2009 swine flu pandemic in Australia This modified the response to focus on people

with high risk of complications from the disease. The national stockpile of antiviral drugs were no longer made available to people with the flu unless there were more than mild symptoms or a high risk of dying. The actual numbers are much larger, as only serious cases warranted being tested and treated at the time. Suspected cases have not been reported by the Department of Health and Ageing since 18 May 2009 because they were changing too quickly to report. Testing at airports was discontinued. On 17 June 2009 the Department of Health and Ageing introduced a new phase called PROTECT. guidelines to code all swine flu deaths to the ICD-10 code of Influenza due to certain identified influenza virus (J09). Sources say that as many as 1600 Australians may have actually died as a result of this virus. "Australian influenza report 2009-12 Australia had 37,537 confirmed cases of H1N1 Influenza 2009 (Human Swine Influenza) and 191 deaths reported by Department of Health but only 77 deaths reported by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. On 23 May 2009 the federal government classified the outbreak as CONTAIN phase except in Victoria where it was escalated

to the SUSTAIN phase on 3 June 2009.

permission to close schools in order to
slow the spread of the disease

disorder (StPD or SPD), also known as
schizotypal disorder, is a mental disorder
characterized by thought disorder,
paranoia, a characteristic form of social
anxiety, derealization, transient
psychosis, and unconventional beliefs.
People with StPD may react oddly in
conversations, such as not responding as
expected, or talking to themselves.
People with this disorder often feel
pronounced discomfort in forming and
maintaining social connections with other
people, primarily due to the belief that
other people harbor negative thoughts
and views about them. They frequently

interpret situations as being strange or having unusual meanings for them; paranormal and superstitious beliefs are common. Those with the disorder often score high on measures for self-disorder

The Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition (DSM-5) classifies StPD as a personality disorder belonging to cluster A, which is a grouping of personality disorders exhibiting traits such as odd and eccentric behavior. In the International Classification of Diseases, the latest edition of which is the ICD-11, schizotypal disorder is not classified as a personality disorder,... d925dc7848 The swine influenza virus is common throughout pig populations worldwide. Transmission of the virus from pigs to humans is rare and does not always lead to human illness, often resulting only in the production of antibodies in the blood. If transmission causes human illness, it is called a zoonotic swine flu. People with regular exposure to pigs are at increased risk of swine flu infections. d925dc7848 Nosography is a description whose primary purpose is enabling a diagnostic

label to be put on the situation. As such, a nosographical entity need not have a single cause. For example, inability to speak due to advanced dementia and an inability to speak due to a stroke could be nosologically different but nosographically the same. d925dc7848

This system of classification was developed in the 1970s as a collaborative project by Robert B Fetter, PhD, of the Yale School of Management, and John D. INA-CBG classifies inpatient episodes using ICD-10 diagnosis codes and ICD-9-CM procedure codes, Diagnosis-related group (DRG) is a system to classify hospital cases into one of originally 467 groups, with the last group (currently coded as 999) being "Ungroupable". The system is also referred to as "the DRGs", and its intent was to identify the "products" that a hospital provides. Examples include appendectomy, normal newborn (vaginal delivery), heart failure or psychoses d925dc7848

Serotype B H. influenzae (hib) can cause illness, called Hib infections, among other names. It has been a major cause of meningitis in infants and small children, frequently causing deafness and mental degradation. The more that is known about the disease, the more ways the disease can be classified nosologically. For example, influenza is classified as an infectious disease because it is caused by a virus, and it is classified as a respiratory infection because the virus infects and damages certain tissues in the respiratory tract d925dc7848

d925dc7848 The system was developed in anticipation of convincing Congress to use it for reimbursement, to replace "cost based" reimbursement that had been used up to that point. DRGs are assigned by a "grouper" program based on ICD (International Classification of Diseases) diagnoses, procedures, age, sex, discharge status, and the presence of complications or comorbidities. DRGs have been used in the US since 1982 to determine how much Medicare pays the hospital for each "product", since patients within each category are clinically similar and are expected to use the same level of hospital resources. It also causes disease in red grouse, and can affect humans. The name 'louping-ill' is derived from an old Scottish word describing the effect of the disease in sheep whereby they 'loup' or spring into the air. Louping-ill is a tick-transmitted disease whose occurrence is closely related to the distribution of the primary vector, the sheep tick *Ixodes ricinus* d925dc7848
