While most cases cause self-limited irritation, medically relevant complications include envenomation, allergic reactions, and transmission of vector-borne diseases. In 1758, Carl Linnaeus described the species in the tenth edition of his *Systema Naturae*, giving the name *Scolopendra coleoptrata*, writing that it has a "coleopterated thorax" (similar to a coleopter). In 1801, Jean-Baptiste Lamarck separated *Scutigera* from *Scolopendra*, calling this species *Scutigera coleoptrata*. Woodlice are suggested to have colonised land during the late Paleozoic based on molecular clock analysis, though the oldest known fossils are from the mid-Cretaceous period around 100 million years ago. This makes them unusual among the crustaceans, being one of the few lineages to have transitioned into a fully terrestrial environment. Woodlice are primarily detritivorous, and are a major contributor to the humification process... Because treatments are required in sleeping areas and other sensitive locations, methods other than chemical pesticides are in demand. Treatments can be costly, laborious, time consuming, repetitive, and embarrassing, and may entail health risks. The insects are 3 to 9 millimetres (0.12 to 0.35 in) long and have flattened reddish-brown bodies with small nonfunctional wings.

Gerridae They are true bugs of the suborder Heteroptera and have mouthparts evolved for piercing and sucking. A distinguishing feature is the ability to move on top of the water's surface, making them pleuston (surface-living) animals. water scooters, water bugs, pond skaters, water skippers, water gliders, water skimmers or puddle flies. They can be found on most ponds, rivers or lakes, and over 1,700 species of gerrids have been described, 10% of them being marine. Woodlice have many common names and although often referred to as terrestrial isopods, some species live semiterrestrally or have recolonised aquatic environments like those of the genus *Ligia*. Woodlice in the families Armadillidae, Armadillidiidae, Eubelidae, Tylidae and some other genera can roll up into a roughly spherical shape (conglobate) as a defensive mechanism or to conserve moisture; others have partial rolling ability, but most cannot conglobate at all. == Description == While 90% of gerrids are freshwater bugs, the oceanic *Halobates* makes the family quite exceptional among insects. The genus *Halobates* was first heavily studied between 1822 and 1883 when Francis Buchanan White collected several different species during the Challenger expedition. Around this time, Eschscholtz discovered three species of the Gerridae, bringing attention to the species, though little of their biology was known. Since then, the Gerridae have been continuously studied due to their ability to walk on water and unique social characteristics.

Scutigera coleoptrata Their mild venom and small organs of envenomation render the species nearly incapable of harming humans. the female then uses it to fertilize her eggs. House centipedes feed on spiders, bed bugs, termites, cockroaches, silverfish, ants, and other household Scutigera coleoptrata, also known as the house centipede, is a species of

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centipede that is typically yellowish-gray and has up to 15 pairs of long legs. It is an insectivore, preying on insects and arachnids by envenomating them. Originating in the Mediterranean region, it has spread to other parts of the world, where it frequently lives in and around human homes

Most hemipterans feed on plants, using their sucking and piercing mouthparts to extract plant sap. Some are bloodsucking, or hematophagous, while others are predators that feed on other insects or small invertebrates. They live in a wide variety of habitats, generally terrestrial, though some are adapted to life in or on the surface of fresh water (e.g. pondskaters, water boatmen, giant water bugs). Hemipterans are hemimetabolous, with young nymphs that somewhat resemble adults. Many aphids are capable of parthenogenesis, producing young from unfertilised eggs; this helps them to reproduce extremely rapidly in favourable conditions.

To be effective, the mesh of a mosquito net must be fine enough to exclude such insects without obscuring visibility or ventilation to unacceptable levels. The netting should be made of stiff cotton or synthetic thread to allow the movement of air. A white net allows the user to see mosquitoes against the background. Netting with 285 holes per square inch is ideal because it is very breathable but will prevent even the smallest mosquito from entering. It is possible to increase the effectiveness of a mosquito net greatly by treating it with an appropriate insecticide or insect repellent.

Species primarily parasitizing bats are known as bat bugs. *Cimex* species are ectoparasites that typically feed on the blood of birds and mammals

Cimicids usually feed on their host's blood every three to seven days, crawling away from the host and hiding while they digest the blood, which may take several days. This means that they specialise in vertebrate hosts that return regularly to particular sites to nest, roost or sleep. Birds and bats suit these specific requirements, as do humans now that they live in dwellings, and these are the main hosts used by the bugs. Most cimicids are able to go for long periods without feeding, over a year in some instances.

In fact, bed bugs thrive in areas where there is an adequate supply of available hosts, and plenty of cracks and harborages within 1.5 metres (4.9 ft) of the host. 5c2b5aefd2 Bed bug infestations spread easily in connecting units and have negative effects on psychological well-being and housing markets. In response, many areas have specific laws about responsibilities upon discovering a bed bug infestation, particularly in hotels and multi-family housing units, because an unprofessional level of response can have the effect of prolonging the invisible part of the infestation and spreading... 5c2b5aefd2

Bed bug Typically, uncovered areas of the body are affected. Symptoms may take between minutes to days to appear and itchiness is generally present. Their bites are not known to transmit any infectious disease. Repeated treatments Bed bugs are insects from the family Cimicidae, primarily from the genus *Cimex*, which are parasites that feed on blood, usually at night. Complications may rarely include areas of dead skin or vasculitis. Bed bug bites may lead to skin changes ranging from small areas of redness to prominent blisters. Their bites can result in a number of health issues, including skin rashes, psychological effects, and allergic symptoms. Some individuals may feel tired or have a fever. Eliminating bed bugs from the home is often difficult, partly because bed bugs can survive up to approximately 300 days without feeding 5c2b5aefd2

Research has shown mosquito nets to be an extremely effective method of malaria prevention. A 2025 analysis by the Malaria Atlas Project reported... 5c2b5aefd2 Bed bug bites are caused primarily by two species of insects: *Cimex lectularius* (the common bed bug) and *Cimex hemipterus*, found primarily in the tropics. Their size ranges between 1 and 7 mm. They spread by crawling between nearby locations or by being carried within personal items. Infestation is rarely due to a lack of hygiene but is more common in high-density areas. Diagnosis involves both finding the bugs and the occurrence of compatible symptoms.
